MAY MEETING

Bessie Wingrove, M.A., 1870-1955, was, in her own right, a character of the Eltham of her time. She was also the daughter of C. S. Wingrove, Secretary and Engineer to the Eltham Road Board and Shire for many years. Wingrove was an important character in Eltham's history and his home, now called "Wingrove Cottage", is still in use today.

Bessie was one of the few early women graduates of Melbourne University. She was also known as an artist. Following her parents' death she remained at "Wingrove Cottage" for the rest of her life.

Mrs. Judith Harley is the President of the Women's Committee of the National Trust. On this subject she speaks from personal experience because of her friendship with the Wingrove family.

As usual, new members and visitors are welcome at this meeting.

SOCIETY BANNER PROJECT:

A small group of members attended the workshop meeting on 23rd April to hear the Shire's Community Arts Officer, Tracey Naughton, talk about the possibility of the Society making its own banner. Tracey has been involved in a number of such projects with other organizations. She has the necessary expertise and enthusiasm to provide instruction to members wishing to participate. It was agreed that the Society should make a banner based on a map of the Shire with buildings and other features of interest shown in their respective locations. Each item of interest could be the project of an individual member and would then be sewn on to complete the banner. Each item would be cut from appropriate material with detail being applied by machining or fabric paint.


Members who attended were enthusiastic about the project. It is anticipated that additional members will want to become involved.

A map showing the location of Meruka House is included in the Newsletter.

No special expertise is required to participate in this project. All members are invited to come along to find out more about it and hopefully to make a contribution. The finished banner will be used in a display of local banners and can then be used by the Society for such events as the Eltham Festival Parade.
