FILM NIGHT FEATURING FILMS ON HISTORIC HOMESTEADS AND OTHERS OF HISTORICAL & LOCAL INTEREST

Peter Bassett-Smith has assembled an interesting collection of films for this meeting. Most of the films were produced for the National Trust and many were shot by Peter.

The films deal with notable Victorian houses, mainly country homesteads including:-

"Warrock" near Casterton, a unique complex of thirty six buildings commenced in 1844.

"Ercildoune" near Ballarat, owned by Sir Samuel Wilson and founded in 1838.

"Bishopscourt", East Melbourne, home of the Archbishop of Melbourne.

"Murndal" in the Wannon Valley, Western Victoria, founded by Samuel Pratt Winter in 1837.

"Bannongil", near Skipton. This property is noted for the daffodils propogated by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Fairbairn.

The remainder of the programme will include local films from Peter's own collection and films on historical subjects from the State Film Centre.

Film nights generally prove popular with our members. These interesting films should maintain the interest in this type of meeting. Visitors and new members are welcome. Supper will be served after the films.

SOCIETY BANNER PROJECT:
