#### NOVEMBER MEETING

Apart from school projects, the majority of enquiries received by the Society relate to family research. Family history is always popular and the trend seems to be increasing. A number of members have compiled or are compiling family histories.

The Genealogical Society of Victoria is the major organization in this state concerned with researching family history. Khaye Brown from that Society will speak to us on what is needed to get started in this interesting field of historical research.
