MAY MEETING

During 1988 Duncan King-Smith conducted a series of interviews with thirty people who have lived and worked in the Shire of Eltham for most of their lives. Excerpts from the recorded interviews have been assembled into a sound programme entitled 'Listening to the Landscape'. It has recently been open to the public at Hurstbridge and will be at various locations around the Shire over the next few months.

Duncan was commissioned by the Eltham Shire Council to carry out this oral history project as part of its Bicentennial programme. He has condensed many hours of interviews into six separate programmes, each with a slightly different theme. Society members who participated in the interviews include Marjorie North, Garnie Burges, Jock Read, Frank Burgoyne, Bruce and Joy Ness, Margaret Banks, Dorothy Wills, Marjorie Smith Motschall and Flo Spicer.

Duncan will talk to us about his experiences in carrying out this project and we will hear some of the material he has assembled. It is expected that this will be material which is not available in the public programme.

ELTHAM TO KINGLAKE EXCURSION

The geology and landform of an area represent the beginning and the basis of the history of that area. They largely determine soil types, vegetation, accessibility, natural resources and other factors which affect settlement and land use. A knowledge of these factors is a major aid to an understanding of detailed local history.

The plan for this excursion on 21st May is to cover the major and most interesting features of the landform and geology of the Shire of Eltham. This will require travelling from the Yarra River at Eltham to the Great Dividing Range at Kinglake. Private cars or mini-bus will be used depending on numbers. If cars are used then seats will be available for those not wishing to drive. To make the necessary decisions we need to know who is going. Please fill in the attached form and return to the May meeting or to the Society's Post Office Box.

We will leave the Eltham Shire Office at 9:00 a.m. and plan to conclude with lunch at the Kinglake National Park at about 1:00 p.m. Comments on the way will be provided by local geologist, Henry Guillaume. Bring your own picnic lunch. There is no charge for the excursion.

HERITAGE WEEK


