Keith Lytton Chappel, licensed surveyor in South Australia and Victoria; b. 8 June 1898, Adelaide; employed as surveyor in Lands Departments of South Australia and Victoria; came to Victoria in 1924; md. 1927 to Lorna Liggett Marrett; 2 s, 3 drs; was employed on survey work in the AMP Closer Settlement Scheme in the Big Desert of Victoria; elected Fellow of the Institute of Surveyors; after retirement to Melbourne in 1963 he took up land settlement research as a hobby; compiled land selection details for Nhill Historical Society and for parts of the Warracknabeal district; he donated his work to the Victorian Public Record Office; died at Heidelberg, Victoria on 9 July 1987, aged 89 years; his ashes were scattered in Chappel Road (named in recognition of his work), Telopea Downs, Victoria.
