ANOTHER GOOD YEAR!

DVFL CONTINUES TO IMPROVE

The DVFL continued its boom of recent years with a vast improvement in Club facilities, Club competition and attendances at all matches.

The most significant highlight this season was the admittance of Watsonia into the competition which meant that the "bye" could be eliminated from the fixture. Watsonia, in their first season in the DVFL, performed creditably for a young club and with a couple of years experience they should prove the faith placed in them by the DVFL. Watsonia continue to be strong in the Under Age Competitions.

In general, the competition has been more open than in recent years and Diamond Creek and Eltham have both broken a long "drought" by appearing in this year's Grand Final. They have heralded a new era to this competition by appearing in today's game, for this is the first time in the history of the D.V.F.L. that the old stalwart clubs of Templestowe, Greensborough, Epping, Reservoir - Lakeside and Heidelberg, have not been among the Grand Finalists in A Grade.

A number of other clubs finished just out of the four, and if luck had gone their way during the season they could have been contesting the finals.

This further suggests that as the population of the Diamond Valley area expands, clubs in the outer developing areas are likely to gain tremendously in both talent and local support. Let us hope, in the interests of the D.V.F.L. that such clubs have sufficient progressive officials so that they may further tap the reservoir of talent and support in their respective territories.

Although only in their second season with the D.V.F.L., Lalor have been able to put a team into a Grand Final. In the interests of the D.V.F.L. in general, and the Lalor club in particular, this is a great achievement.

As is inevitable in any competitive sport, some clubs appear to be much weaker than others. If one looked only at the premiership ladder this would be true. However, clubs on the lower rungs of the ladder have demonstrated during the season that they are worthy of a higher position on the ladder.

Probably what is lacking in such

clubs is the ability to play consistently throughout the season which appears to be a function of experience.

Given an active committee, most clubs can break out of the doldrums although, when a club is down, support at times is difficult to get.

Comments heard recently rate the D.V.F.L. as one of the best competitions (outside the V.F.L. and V.F.A.) in the metropolitan area. This observation is evidenced by the increase in attendances at both home-and-away games and the current final series. Support has also been given to our Sunday competition where the stars of the future have been showing their talents.

In fact on Grand Final day for the D and E Grade competitions, over \$100 was taken on the gate through 20 cent (per car load!) donations. This is surely a feather in the cap of all concerned with these competitions.

The Record this year has not done as much "stirring" as in the past, mainly because the opportunities are not arising as frequently as they once did a mark of improvement in the League!

The main failure of The Record this year has been the lack of letters from interested readers re their views. Whether this is a result of anathy or "no views" is an undecided question, although recent letters published have caused considerable argument within

We trust you will continue to follow the D.V.F.L. in 1970 and help to improve the standard of all aspects of our competition.


