METHODS OF FUNDRAISING

In the early years of the club it is not known how fundraising was done. From 1940, members too turns to run card afternoons during the winter recess. Members were paired, and as hostesses, they provided afternoon tea, card prizes and raffles. The card afternoons were held in The Mechanics Institute until the clubhouse was rebuilt in the early 50's. Solo and 500 were the games in vogue. Competition was fierce, as each pair was trying to outdo the previous hostess. In the 50's Agnus Clymo commenced euchre nights. These ran well into the 80's with Gwen Bain taking over when Agnus passed away in her period of presidency, Agnus ran an opportunity shop which raised over one thousand pounds.

As years went by, a change came in fundraising. Cootie and Bingo days were held, along with goose club raffles, trading tables, and cake stalls. We shared in football and cricket cards receiving half of what we sold. Five week draws on the supplementary number in Tattslotto were used to pay for the insurance. Flea markets came in and we held several trash and treasure stalls at different venues.

Theatre trips to Melbourne were a good revenue raiser. These were started up by Nance Williams, assisted by Agnus Clymo for three years. Nell Mitchell then took over for ten years, and then Betty Attwater ran them for a further twelve years. They brought in good revenue over a twenty five year period. In the early days of the trips, seats could be booked and paid for , a fortnight before the show. At the latter end, seats had to be booked and paid for three to four months before the show. In the early years \$10 would cover the cost of the theatre and bus. In 1966 the cost had risen to \$65 and payment had to be made three months in advance. Theatre trips are out of range now, but Betty runs pokie trips once a month.

Another fundraising was to arrange casserole luncheons. They commenced in the swimming club building at a cost of \$2.50, then we moved to The Church of England hall. Orders were taken from shopkeepers. These meals were served from members homes and a smorgasbord was served at the hall. Members provided all casseroles and sweets. Unfortunately the luncheons came to an end as costs became prohibitive. For years members paid into a trophy fund. In 1980 a social committee was formed for winter fundraising. Dance nights and games afternoons were held along with coffee mornings, where members performed skits. These were very popular and drew large audiences. We also held linen parties, clothing displays, plant demonstrations and floral art displays, and all helped to add to the club finances. An annual theatre morning and luncheon is held in conjunction with other district clubs.

The foregoing information in the history of the Eaglehawk Croquet Club has been reviewed by checking past records. I have endeavored to list all of the main events, but many names are missing. I apologize for any errors. If they come to light in the later years, they will be corrected. My sincere thanks go to Eddie Hunt of Sandringham Croquet Club for researching our club in the early years and passing the information onto me. The

Eaglehawk Borough Council, which ceased to exist in 1993, gave their wholehearted support of the club.

Last but by no means least, my sincere thanks to club member Mavis Redmond for her patience with me, as she had to redo so many of my incorrect sheets, during the compiling of the history; and to my granddaughter Alicia Mitchell who computed the summary of events.

GOLF CROQUET SECTION

The Golf Croquet Section was formed in 1976. President Gwen Bain and Secretary Nell Mitchell organised games for players until 1978 when Mary Smith, who joined in 1977, took on Captaincy and controlled the games. Merle O'Meara is an original member, joining the Club as a social member in 1975, then Golf Croquet in 1976.

Golf Croquet players are not affiliated with the V.C.A. Under incorporate rules they have no vote, are allotted lawns 1-5 p.m. on Wednesday, and extra time when needed. Fees are fixed at the Annual Meeting.

In 1976 fees were \$2.00 with 20c. green fees. In 1981 they rose to \$4.00 with 50c. green fees. In 1985 they were \$5.00 with \$1.00 green fees. In 1988 \$10.00 with \$1.50 green fees In 1994 \$13.00 with \$2.00 green fees. In 1996 \$15.00 with \$2.00 green fees. Biscuits, tea and sugar etc. are available to players.

During the playing season, Club uniform must be worn. White or brown flat soled shoes, with predominately white dress or slacks. Navy jackets can be worn. Season is from Opening Day to Closing Day Players are expected to take their turn on the cleaning roster.

Eaglehawk held their first Annual Tournament in 1979, this being the first Golf Croquet Tournament held between Clubs. In 1992 a Tournament was held for Sports Focus Medals, this is an Annual event now held in October.

To raise money to purchase Dawson balls, Golf Croquet ran a trash & treasure stall to purchase four sets. Previously they were using smooth Australian balls, and found they were at a disadvantage when they visited other clubs. Club Tournaments are played throughout the season.

1909 THE EAGLEHAWK CROQUET CLUB WAS FOUNDED ON PREMISES VACATED BY EAGLEHAWK BOWLING CLUB. CROQUET HAD TO PAY THE BOWLING CLUB THE SUM OF TEN POUNDS BEFORE THEY COULD TAKE OVER THE LAWNS EVEN THOUGH THE BOROUGH COUNCIL WERE IN AGREEMENT FOR CROQUET TO USE THE GROUND. THE MONEY TO PAY THE BOWLING CLUB WAS RAISED BY TWO FOUNDATION MEMBERS CANVASSING THE TRADESPEOPLE FOR DONATIONS TO PAY SAME. FOUNDATION MEMBERS WERE: MESDAMES THOMPSON, SAMSON, LOUDEN, RALPH, MATTERSON WALKER, LAYCOCK, CATFORD, JEFFRIES, MISSES COOK, TAYLOR, PRESIDENT MRS. SMALLEY. UP UNTIL 1922 TWO PEGS WERE USED IN THE GAME, THE TURNING PEG WAS PLACED BETWEEN HOOPS TWO AND THREE, THIS PEG HAD TO BE HIT AFTER MAKING THE SIXTH HOOP BEFORE ONE COULD BE MADE. WHEN ROVER HOOP WAS RUN IT WAS POSSIBLE TO HIT THE WINNING PEG IN ONE STROKE AS THAT WAS SITUATED BETWEEN HOOP ONE AND TWO. UP UNTIL 1914 THE BALLS WERE PLAYED IN SEQUENCE, BLUE, RED, BLACK, YELLOW, THEN EITHER BALL IN THE TURN WAS BROUGHT IN.

IT WAS IN 1922 THAT THE CENTER PEG GAME SUPERSEDED THE TWO PEG GAME. NO RECORDS ARE AVAILABLE 1909-1943. THE CLUBHOUSE WAS AN UNLINED HUT, NO ELECTRICITY, NO WATER INSIDE BUT THERE WAS A GASRING. IN EARLY DAYS OF THE GAME THE OPENING DAYS WERE AKIN TO A FASHION PARADE, HUSBAND OF THE PRESIDENT ALWAYS PERFORMED THE OPENING, AND A SUMPTUOUS AFTERNOON TEA WAS SERVED. VISITORS CAME LADEN WITH GIFTS FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE DAY.

1930 THE LIFT WAS INTRODUCED INTO THE GAME ON STANDARD LAWNS.

1940-42 PARKS AND GARDENS COMMITTEE TOOK OVER UPKEEP OF GREENS FOR NINE MONTHS AS CLUB WAS IN DIRE CIRCUMSTANCES. IT WAS DURING THE SECOND WORLD WAR WHEN MEMBERSHIP DROPPED TO SEVEN. GWEN BAIN JOINED THE CLUB IN 1941, GWEN IS NOW A LIFE MEMBER AND WORKED DILIGENTLY FOR THE CLUB THROUGHOUT THE YEARS GWEN BECAME A REFEREE IN 1964, LEVEL 1 COACH IN 1983, AND HELD EVERY OFFICE IN THE CLUB. DURING THE WAR YEARS FUND RAISING WAS HELD FOR MANY CHARITY ORGANISATIONS. FOOD RATIONING WAS IN AND MEMBERS PROVIDED TEA AND SUGAR COUPONS OUT OF THEIR HOUSEHOLD RATIONS. IN THIS PERIOD MEMBERSHIP WAS TWO POUNDS, NOMINATION FEE ONE GUINEA, THE CLUB HAD ONLY TWO SMALL LAWNS. MEMBERS TOP DRESSED THE LAWNS, SOWED NEW SEED, CUT HEDGES THAT SURROUNDED THE LAWNS. THE GREENKEEPER OF THE DAY GOT 5/-TO CUT THE LAWNS ONCE A FORTNIGHT. THE LAWNS WERE CLOSED IN APRIL, DID NOT REOPEN TILL SEPTEMBER AND WERE NOT CUT DURING THE WINTER MONTHS.

NEW MEMBER HAD TO BE NOMINATED BY TWO MEMBERS, THE NAME PUT ON THE BOARD FOR A MONTH WHEN A SECRET BALLOT WAS TAKEN, ALL MEMBERS HAD TO BE IN FAVOUR OTHERWISE THE NOMINEE WAS NOT ACCEPTED INTO THE CLUB.

1943-46 THE FIRST MINUTE BOOK AVAILABLE WAS IN 1943, THE BANK BALANCE WAS 17/-/-. THE CLUB HOUSE WAS PAINTED AT A COST OF 9/-/-. BY 1946 MEMBERSHIP HAD INCREASED TO 23 AND THE CLUB HAD A BANK BALANCE OF 27/4/1 THIS WAS THE HIGHEST AMOUNT SINCE THE COUNCIL HAD TAKEN OVER UPKEEP OF LAWNS. WATER RATE WAS 7/-/- ANNUALLY. THE GREENKEEPER GOT THE SUM OF 26/-/- OVER TWELVE MONTHS.

1947-50

JACQUES BALLS COST 8/15/-, THIS IS THE FIRST RECORDED ENTRY OF BALL COSTS. ELECTRICITY WAS CONNECTED TO THE CLUB HOUSE AT COST 4/18/- THE GREENKEEPERS WAGE WENT TO 1/-/- PER WEEK WHILE THE LAWNS WERE OPEN. A SHELTER WAS BUILT ONTO END OF CLUBHOUSE (WHERE EXTENSION IS NOW) BY FRANK FITZPATRICK HUSBAND OF JEAN A VERY ACTIVE MEMBER IN THE CLUB. IN 1949 THE FOUR BENDIGO CLUBS PARTICIPATED IN PENNANT GAMES AS A TRIAL, GOLDEN SQUARE WITHDREW AND EAGLEHAWK C. GRADE WAS RUNNER UP TO QUARRY HILL.

1951-54 THE ASHMAN FAMILY DONATED A SHELTER SEAT TO THE CLUB IN MEMORY OF MRS. C. ASHMAN SR, (A MEMBER FROM 1931). THE CLUB WANTED TO EXPAND TO 3 LAWNS SO THEY WERE REMEASURED UP TO THE TENNIS DOUBLE GATES, THE TENNIS COURT WOULD NOT ALLOW ANY EXTENSION INTO THEIR GROUND. NEW MOWER WAS PURCHASED 112/-/AND ELECTRICITY 4/5/- ANNUALLY, IN 1953 THE CLUB CONSTITUTION WAS DRAWN UP LIMITING MEMBERSHIP TO 30 A TIN DISH AND TRAY WAS USED FOR DISH WASHING, THERE WAS NO WATER CONNECTED TO THE CLUBHOUSE. BANK BALANCE WAS 35/4/11.

1955-58 THE CLUBHOUSE WAS REBUILT AND ENLARGED AT A COST OF 359/-/- UNLINED, VENETIAN BLINDS COST 18/5/-. JAQUES BALL WENT UP IN COST TO 9/16/-. IN 1957 THE ROOMS WERE LINED FOR 55/-/- CLUB ENDORSED JR. NAVY CARDIGANS AS PART OF THEIR UNIFORM. CLUB HOUSE WAS BROKEN INTO, RECORD BOOKS FROM 1943 BACK TO 1909 WERE LOST ALSO TWO SETS OF HOOPS.

1959-63 MESDAMES J. FITPATRICK, A. WILKINSON STEWART AND MRS. M. LYONS ALL HARDWORKING MEMBERS WERE RECIPIENTS OF LIFE MEMBERSHIP IN APPRECIATION OF SERVICES TO THE CLUB. OUR 50TH ANNIVERSARY WAS CELEBRATED. SISTER CLUBS AND OLD MEMBERS

WERE INVITED TO CELEBRATE AND AFTERNOON TEA WAS HELD IN THE R.S.L HALL. PRESIDENT OF THE DAY WAS AGNUS CLYMO. DURING HER TERM OF OFFICE MONIES WERE RAISED TO IMPROVE STANDARDS, OVER 1000/-/- WAS RAISED BY WAY OF AN OPPORTUNITY SHOP. SOME IMPROVEMENTS WERE 2 DOZEN PADDED CHAIRS 81/-/-, 2 DOZEN MASONITE CHAIRS 24/-/-, 7 DOZEN CUPS AND SAUCERS 28/7/-, SPIKE ROLLER 65/-/-, ELECTRIC URN 21/14/-. THE SHELTER ON SIDE OF THE CLUBHOUSE WAS CLOSED AND FLOOR CEMENTED. ALL OF THIS WORK WAS VOLUNTARY BY HUSBANDS OF MEMBERS. THE THREE LONG TABLES COST 10/-/- AGNUS CLYMO DONATED ONE, SYD RAWLINGS MADE UP THE OTHER TWO FOR MATERIAL COST ONLY. JACQUES WERE ON THE RISE NOW 11/-/. BALLS WERE GETTING PIECES OUT OF THEM AND HAD TO BE MENDED SO THEY COULD BE KEPT IN USE. EPOXY RESIN WAS USED TO MEND THEM, RON MITCHELL MENDED THE BALLS FROM 1957-81, THIS WAS NECESSARY AS THEY WERE ONLY BALLS ON THE MARKET AND HARD TO GET. CLUB GETS IT'S FRIDGE (SECOND HAND) AND CLUB FLOOR WHICH WAS STAINED HAD LINO PUT DOWN. PAST PRESIDENTS BOARD WAS DONATED BY ETHEL AND SYD RAWLINGS. RUTH BRANSON WAS THE CLUB'S FIRST DISTRICT CHAMPION. SEWERAGE WAS CONNECTED IN 1961 AND PAID FOR BY 1962, MEMBERS WERE LEVIED TO PAY FOR SAME. BISCUITS WERE INTRODUCED FOR AFTERNOON TEA, MEMBERS PAID 6 PENCE FOR SAME. DRESS OF THE DAY, SHORT OR LONG SLEEVES, COLLAR, BUTTON TO WAIST, HEM TO TOUCH GROUND WHEN KNEELING. WEEKLY EUCHRE WERE COMMENCED BY AGNUS CLYMO IN 1962.

1964-1966. INTER CLUB DAYS WERE HELD, NO FEES WERE CHARGED, HOME CLUB PROVIDED FREE LUNCH & AFTERNOON TEA.

NELL MITCHELL & ETHEL RAWLINGS BECAME THE FIRST OFFICIAL V.C.A. REFEREES OF THE CLUB IN 1963. RITA COX WAS APPOINTED SECRETARY OF THE BENDIGO & DISTRICT ASSOCIATION.

IN 1964 RITA COX, GWEN BAIN ELIZABETH CASEY & ANGUS CLYMO BECAME V.C.A. REFEREES.

IN 1965 RITA COX TRANSFERRED TO BENDIGO CLUB TO TAKE UP "A"

GRADE PLAY AFTER WINNING THE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS IN 1964.

IN 1965 RITA COX TRANSFERRED TO BENDIGO CLUB TO TAKE UP "A"
GRADE PLAY AFTER WINNING THE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS IN 1964.
1964 SAW THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE REGIONALS. JACK MORRIS JOINED
US AS A GREENKEEPER, JNR A PLAY WAS INTRODUCED TO THE
REGIONALS.

ELIZABETH CASEY BECAME PRESIDENT OF THE BENDIGO & DISTRICT CROQUET ASSOCIATION FOR 3 YEARS, NELL MITCHELL WAS TREASURER FOR 7 YEARS.

IN 1966 LAURA DAVIES WON THE "B" GRADE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.
LAURA THEN TRANSFERRED TO BENDIGO "A" GRADE PLAY.
IN FEBRUARY 1966, POUNDS, SHILLINGS, & PENCE CHANGED OVER TO
DOLLARS & CENTS.

THE CYCLONE FENCE ON THE STREET WAS ERECTED BY COUNCIL. CLUB PAID \$70 TOWARDS THE COST. THAT INCLUDED THE LARGE ENTRANCE GATE, THE LENGTH OF LAWNS AT THAT TIME.

SYD RAWLINGS, HUSBAND OF PRESIDENT ETHEL, BUILT IN SEATING, SHELVES & PARTITIONS DURING THE WINTER RECESS. PART OF THIS SERVED AS AN EQUIPMENT ROOM AND PART SCREENED OFF THE KITCHEN AREA.

IN 1966 V.C.A. AFFILIATION WAS \$3. ETHEL RAWLINGS WON COUNTRY WEEK "C" GRADE, AND THIS WAS THE CLUBS-EDIST COUNTRY WEEK WIN.

1967 - 1970. PLAYING FEES WERE 25 CENTS MIDWEEK, AND 35 CENTS ON SATURDAY. PLAYERS ROTATED FOR PENNANT PLAY. CLUB UNIFORMS WERE WORN ON OPENING DAY FOR THE FIRST TIME. HAND WATERING WAS DONE BECAUSE OF DROUGHT CONDITIONS. DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS WERE HELD AT EAGLEHAWK, AS BENDIGO LAWNS HAD A DISEASE, WHICH WAS CAUSED BY THE DROUGHT, COUNTRY WEEK WAS CANCELLED THAT YEAR.

IN 1969 A TOOL SHED WAS PURCHASED IN LIEU OF THE CELEBRATION OF THE CLUB'S 60TH BIRTHDAY. THIS SHED REPLACED THE OLD SHED WHICH WAS APPROX 4FT 9IN HIGH X 4FT 9IN WIDE. IT HELD ONLY THE OLD MOWER, AND IT PROPPED UP THE OLD LAVATORY. THE LAVATORY WAS EMPTIED EVERY WEEK BY THE NIGHT MAN. THE PRESENT SHED HAS HAD THREE SHIFTS UNTIL IT HAD OCCUPIED IT'S PRESENT SITE. ALL OF THIS WORK WAS DONE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DAY.

IDA TAYLOR & EVIE COAKES WERE DISTRICT CHAMPIONS IN 1969. IDA WON THE "B" GRADE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP, AND EVIE WAS RUNNER UP IN THE "C" GRADE.

JACK MORRIS, OUR GREENKEEPER, LEFT TO WORK IN MELBOURNE. HE WAS A BIG LOSS TO OUR CLUB.

1971-1974. JACQUES BALLS ROSE SHARPLY IN PRICE TO \$79.

NANCE WILLIAMS COMMENCED THEATER TRIPS AS A METHOD OF FUNDRAISING. AGNES CLYMO WAS HER ASSISTANT.

THE LAWNS WERE EXTENDED 3FT ON THE POOL SIDE. THIS ENABLED THE CLUB TO HAVE ONE FULL SIZED "A" LAWN. SYD RAWLINGS & FRANK CLYMO TOOK CHARGE OF THESE EXTENSIONS. DURING THIS PERIOD SYD & FRANK HAD A DIFFERENCE IN OPINION OVER THE QUALITY OF SOIL PURCHASED. THIS RESULTED IN ETHEL RAWLINGS, THE PRESIDENT OF THE DAY, RESIGNING FROM THE CLUB. FRANK CONTINUED WITH THE EXTENSIONS, AND HE WAS ASSISTED BY MICK SUMMERS, WHO WAS THE EAGLEHAWK FIRE BRIGADE CAPTAIN.

AT CHRISTMAS, MEMBERS HAD A SUMPTUOUS AFTERNOON TEA AND GIETS WERE EXCHANGED TO THE VALUE OF ASCENTED BY MICK WAS

GIFTS WERE EXCHANGED TO THE VALUE OF 25CENTS. PUNCH WAS SERVED AND THE PRESIDENT PROVIDED A CHRISTMAS CAKE.

THE CLUB HELD IT'S FIRST OPEN TOURNAMENT FOR DIVISIONS 3 & 4.

NELL MITCHELL TOOK OVER AS PRESIDENT WHEN ETHEL RESIGNED, AS THE CLUB WAS IN TURMOIL FOR SEVERAL WEEKS. RON MITCHELL THEN TOOK ON THE ODD JOBS AND CARRIED OUT ANY BUILDING REPAIRS. PRESIDENT NELL DONATED THE CLUB DYE BADGE, AND LIL DAVEY PRESENTED A PERPETUAL TROPHY TO THE CLUB. THIS WAS NAMED THE NELL MITCHELL TROPHY, HOWEVER IT IS KNOWN AS THE EMBLEM TROPHY TO PERPETUATE THE CLUB DYE.

IT WAS DURING THIS PERIOD THAT MEMBERS WHO WON AT AN OPEN TOURNAMENT WERE TREATED TO AFTERNOON TEA.
A SOCIAL FEE WAS STRUCK FOR PEOPLE WHO DID NOT WANT TO PLAY CROQUET, BUT STILL WISHED TO BE PART OF OUR CLUB.
OUR CROQUET FEES ALSO ROSE TO \$10.

1975-1978 GOLF CROQUET SECTION WAS INTRODUCED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE DAY, GWEN BAIN. WEEKLY PLAY WAS HELD ON WEDNESDAY AFTERNOONS, AND CONDUCTED BY GWEN BAIN & NELL MITCHELL. NELL MITCHELL TOOK OVER THE THEATRE TRIP FUND WHICH WAS STARTED IN 1973. SHE DID THIS FOR 10 YEARS AND THEN BETTY ATTWATER TOOK OVER FOR 12 YEARS.

GREENKEEPERS CAME AND WENT "LIKE FLIES", AND OUR LAWNS WERE DETERIORATING QUICKLY. JACK MATHRICK AND CLARRIE KELLY (BOWLING CLUB MEMBERS) CAME TO OUR ASSISTANCE WITH EXPERT ADVICE. ALBIE GILBEE (ANOTHER BOWLER) TOOK ON THE UPKEEP OF THE LAWNS FOR 7 YEARS, AND WE SAW A GREAT IMPROVEMENT. OUR 2 MALE MEMBERS KEN GOLDSMITH AND WALLY HEEPS, DID A STERLING JOB IN ASSISTING THE GREENKEEPER.

IN 1976 GOLF CROQUET FEES WERE \$2 AND CROQUET FEES WERE \$15. MEMBERS WITH 25 YEARS SERVICE IN CROQUET WERE TO RECEIVE A VETERANS BADGE.

V.C.A. CHARGE WAS \$1 PER MEMBER AND A.C.A. WAS \$0.20. KEN GOLDSMITH WAS RUNNER UP IN THE "C" GRADE REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

NORTHERN DISTRICT CROQUET ASSOCIATION HELD ITS FIRST OFFICIAL OPENING OF CROQUET.

1979-1982 DAHLIA DOUBLES HAD BEEN RUN FOR SEVERAL YEARS TO COINCIDE WITH THE DAHLIA AND ARTS FESTIVAL. THESE WERE DISCONTINUED IN 1980.GOLF CROQUET HELD ITS FIRST ANNUAL TOURNAMENT.

A CLEANER WAS ENGAGED ONCE A WEEK TO CLEAN THE CLUB HOUSE. WHEN SHE RESIGNED, EDNA SHADBOLT VOLUNTEERED HER SERVICES, AND CONTINUED IN THAT JOB FOR 3 YEARS. WHEN EDNA BECAME PRESIDENT IN1982, MEMBERS FORMED A ROSTER FOR CLEANING. IN 1979 JACQUES BALLS' WERE \$100 PER SET.

WATER PIPES WERE REPLACED TO THE LAWN, 22 METRES OF 1.24 INCH COPPER PIPING IN THE MAINS.

COUNCIL SPOKE OF SHIFTING THE LAWNS, AND THE MEMBERS WERE NOT IN FAVOUR.. COUNCIL GRANTED US 70 FEET OF LAND, TO ENABLE US TO HAVE 2 FULL SIZED LAWNS. THIS EXTENSION WAS OVER THE HARD TENNIS COURT AREA. COUNCIL BUILT UP THE AREA, PLANTED LAWN, RELOCATED THE TOOL SHED, AND SUPPLIED A CYCLONE FENCE. THE TOTAL COST WAS \$3000, AND THE CLUB HAD TO PAY \$1000.

LIFE MEMBER MRS. WILKINSON- STEWART TURNED 100 YEARS.

PRESIDENT ELSIE GOLDSMITH AND HUSBAND KEN, DONATED A SET OF HOOPS FOR THE 4TH LAWN.

KEN BUILDS A SHED ATTACHED TO THE TOOL SHED TO KEEP THE SAND. KEN GOLDSMITH PLAYS IN THE V.C.A.. BRONZE MEDAL, AN INVITATION EVENT AND HE WAS RUNNER UP. (JR.A).

WALLY HEEPS WAS REGIONAL WINNER IN "B" GRADE.

CROQUET FEES RISE TO \$20, AND GOLF CROQUET \$5.

THE GREENKEEPING FEES WERE \$15 PER WEEK.

IN 1981 AUTOMATIC WATERING WAS INSTALLED AT A COST OF \$2639, WITH 90 DAYS TO PAY. AN ANONYMOUS DONOR LENT MONEY TO THE CLUB INTEREST FREE, AND THE LOAN WAS TO BE REPAID WITHIN 12 MONTHS. MEMBERS WERE LEVIED 50 CENTS PER WEEK UNTIL THE LOAN WAS REPAID.

ELSIE GOLDSMITH AND BETTY KERR PASSED THE V.C.A. REFEREES EXAM. SMOOTH AUSTRALIAN BALLS WERE INTRODUCED INTO THE CLUB AT A COST OF \$70 PER SET. THIS WAS A BIG DIFFERENCE TO JACQUES BALLS WHICH WERE \$150 PER SET.

A SOCIAL COMMITTEE WAS FORMED FOR FUND RAISING DURING THE WINTER RECESS.

DOT SPEECHLY WAS RUNNER UP IN THE "C" GRADE REGIONALS.
THE CLUB ENTERED A FLOAT IN THE DAHLIA & ARTS PROCESSION. WE
WON AWARDS IN THE DAY AND NIGHT PROCESSIONS, AND THE EASTER
FAIR PROCESSION. THE PRIZE MONEY TOTALED \$119.

WE ARE FORCED TO HAND WATER THE LAWNS AGAIN FOR 7 MONTHS DUE TO THE DROUGHT..

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS WAS CHANGED IN 1981 TO THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIPS AND ANYONE COULD ENTER.

1983 - 1986 CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS WAS BROUGHT BACK IN 1984. THE FIRST OPEN TOURNAMENT IN ALL GRADES WAS HELD. NELL MITCHELL & GWEN BAIN BECAME THE FIRST A.C.A. ACCREDITED COACHES IN THE BENDIGO AREA..

A SECURITY LIGHT WAS PUT ONTO OUR POLE. THE COUNCIL ARE TO PAY \$50 PER YEAR TOWARDS THE COSTS.

NELL MITCHELL RESIGNS FROM RUNNING THE THEATRE TRIPS AFTER 10 YEARS. BETTY ATTWATER (GOLF CROQUET MEMBER) TOOK ON THE JOB. JOAN MOSS WHO IS A SOCIAL MEMBER ASSISTS BETTY.

MARG PRICE WON DIVISION 4 REGIONAL.

A MEN'S GROUP WAS FORMED BETWEEN THE CLUBS AND COMMENCED MONTHLY PLAY AT EAGLEHAWK ON SUNDAYS. THIS FELL BY THE WAYSIDE AFTER 12 MONTHS.

IN 1983 HOULDENS COACH TOURS COMMENCED SPONSORSHIP IN 2 SECTIONS OF OUR OPEN TOURNAMENT. THIS SPONSORSHIP CONTINUED FOR 10 YEARS UNTIL THE DEATH OF THE OWNER, TREVOR HOULDEN. CROQUET FEES INCREASED TO \$25. CHAMPIONSHIP FEES TO N.D.C.A. INCREASED TO \$5 PER ENTRY.

THE CLUB HOUSE WALL WAS BRICKED, AND ALUMINUM CLADDING WAS PLACED ON THE CLUB HOUSE...

THE CLUB PAYS FOR DELEGATES EXPENSES TO N.D.C.A. MEETINGS. A CROOUET LIBRARY IS COMMENCED BY NELL MITCHELL.

CLUB GLASSES WERE INTRODUCED AS TROPHIES.

TRANSPORT CHARGES WERE FIXED FOR PENNANT & SOCIAL DAYS.
WIMMERA ASSOCIATION JOINS IN REGIONAL, AND THE FOLLOWING YEAR

SOUTH WESTERN JOIN.

1987-1990 FRAN TOY MADE A LIFE MEMBER AFTER 17 YEARS AS TREASURER.

NELL MITCHELL PASSES THE A.C.A. REFEREE EXAM.
CLOTH BADGES WERE INTRODUCED INTO THE CLUB.
ELAINE MCQUALTER (DIVISION 1) AND DOT CHRISTIE (DIVISION 3)
REPRESENTED N.D.C.A. AT REGIONALS. ELAINE WAS RUNNER UP.
THE TOOLSHED FLOOR WAS CONCRETED, AND A SCARIFIER WAS
PURCHASED FOR \$1105. ROD KIRK TOOK OVER THE UPKEEP OF THE
LAWNS.

MARG PRICE WON DIVISION 2 AT COUNTRY WEEK, AND THEN RECEIVED AN INVITATION TO PLAY IN THE V.C.A. BRONZE MEDAL.

ELAINE MCQUALTER RECEIVED AN INVITATION TO PLAY IN THE SILVER MEDAL.DOT CHRISTIE WON THE EAGLEHAWK OPEN TOURNAMENT WITH BREAKS OF 10 AND OVER IN EVERY GAME. DIV. 3.

THE OLD PAVILION WAS DEMOLISHED BY KEN GOLDSMITH, RON MITCHELL, AND REG WEEKLEY.

1997: Elsie Goldsmith and her family donated a shield for competition to be known as the Ken Goldsmith Memorial Trophy. The family also donated \$30-00 per year for 12 years. This was for the purchase of a suitable trophy for each year's winner. The event was to be played in the first year by Sections 1 & 2, with Sections 3 & 4 competing in the second and alternate years. Sections 1 & 2 were to play on large lawns, with full bisquing, and play to be over 2.5 hours. Sections 3 & 4 to compete on small lawns, over 2 hours, with full bisquing.

The Club appreciated the fact that Walter Stables attended to all of the Club's photo-copying free of charge.

1998: The Club recorded a vote of thanks to Val Gibbs, who decorated the cakes for birthdays and other social events.

The NDCA requested all clubs to consider the policy of presenting badges to pennant winners, instead of pennant flags. Clubs voted to retain the pennant flags, as pennant is a club event, rather than an individual event.

Fundraising efforts included a Blumes Clothing Display, and catering for dances at Spring Gully and St. Mark's, Golden Square.

Club fees were set at \$40-00 for croquet players; Restricted, \$25-00 (for members who do not wish to play pennant, or compete in club tournaments etc.); \$31-00 for golf croquet players who wish to be affiliated with the VCA and NDCA; \$15-00 for other golf croquet players; and \$2-00 for social members. Green fees were set at \$3-00 for a full day, and \$2-00 for a half-day.

One Club glass to be given to winners of the Spring, Emblem and K.Crane trophies.

1999: A new urn was purchased at a cost of \$60-00. New tablecloths were also purchased.

It was agreed that members playing in club events in their own time would not need to wear whites. This also applied to referees who would be officiating at these events.

The exterior painting of the clubhouse, roof, toilets and shelters was completed at a cost of \$1500-00.

Gutter guards for the spouting of the clubhouse cost \$690-00.

Bill and Rose Bullock (Rose Chapel Leadlighting) donated a leadlight window for the clubhouse.

A new refrigerator was purchased at a cost of \$799-00.

Dorothy Christie applied to the Anti-Cancer Council for permission to register the club for *The Biggest Morning Tea*, in order to raise funds towards the Anti-Cancer appeal. Croquet and golf croquet are played, and sister clubs are invited to participate.

Fees: Croquet \$45-00; Restricted \$25-00; Golf Croquet \$16-00; Affiliation with VCA & NDCA \$19-00; Social member \$2-00; Green fees were \$3-00 for a full day and \$2-00 for a half-day.

Assisted by a grant from the State Government during the *International Year Of Older Persons*, we were able to connect the telephone to the clubrooms at a cost of \$330-00.

Our Printing of notices etc. is done by Gwen Tatnall and Jim McQualter.

Lawns 3 and 4 were lasered, levelled and planted with grass sprigs from Neangar Park Golf Club. With many extras such as nails, hooks, etc. having to be purchased for the work, it is difficult to arrive at an exact cost, but the total cost would be in the vicinity of \$5,500-00.

All members and family members assisted with the work involved. The City of Greater Bendigo Council assisted with a grant of \$2,600-00

The 90th. Birthday of the Club was held on December 4th. The oldest playing member, Nell Mitchell, cut the cake, which was decorated by Val Gibbs.President Dorothy Christie read the history of the club, and unveiled the leadlight window.

2000: Saturday morning play was commenced, with an early finish in the afternoon to avoid the heat and cold.

On July 11th., we invited all those who had supported our Pokie trips to join us for afternoon tea.

Fees: Croquet \$50-00; Golf Croquet \$38-00. All other fees remained as for the previous year.

After 34 years as Honorary Auditor, David Trewarne finished his service to the club. A clock was presented to David in appreciation of his contribution over a long period of time.

Golf croquet players M.Smith, D.Pianta and J.Aisbett passed the examination for Golf Croquet Referees.

2000 ctd.: Golf Croquet championships were to be played in 2 sections.

Gippsland Region was accepted to play in the Regional Championships.

With a grant from the City of Greater Bendigo Council, a back-flow valve and tap were installed in the watering system.

Croquet Week was held in Victoria in November. Eaglehawk Club held a Come and Try Day, followed by a BBQ at 6.00 p.m. on the Friday.

Money-raising projects included Dances, Blumes Fashions, Pokie trips and Safeway Demonstrations.

June Grinter was invited to play in the Bronze Medal.

Lawns 1 and 2 were laser levelled, and replanted with grass sprigs from our other lawns. More soil was needed for these lawns, so the cost rose to approximately \$5,900-00. Members and family members again assisted with the work. Our greenkeeper, Rod Kirk worked very hard with the project.

Vandals presented a problem, as the lawns, doors, windows and screens were damaged from time to time.

2001: We were now able to play on all our new lawns. Thanks to the Eaglehawk Bowling Club for their assistance and advice.

A gas BBQ was purchased for \$254-90, and we were then able to hold monthly BBQ's. Croquet and Golf Croquet members take it in turns to organise the BBQ's. Charge: \$5-00. Proceeds from the BBQ's enable us to compensate for funds lost when the Pokie trips were discontinued. Betty Attwater had organised the Pokie trips for many years, but attendances fell, and the trips were discontinued. Betty was presented with an engraved photograph frame from the club, in appreciation of her efforts.

Fees: Croquet \$55-00; Golf croquet \$43-00; All other fees remained as in previous years.

Two sets of third-colour balls were purchased at a cost of \$584-00.

With a grant from VICHealth of \$400-00, we were able to purchase a line-marker, and a tool set for the small jobs around the club. Our thanks to Lindsay Grinter and Grahame Hookey for attending to the maintenance jobs from time to time.

2002: Our thanks to Bob Aisbett for making boxes in which to store the third-colour balls and Golf Croquet balls.

A new vacuum cleaner was purchased for \$289-00.

Students from Eaglehawk, Kangaroo Flat and Golden Square Secondary Colleges visited the club, and played golf croquet.

Fees: Croquet \$58-00; Golf Croquet \$45-00. All other fees remained the same.

VicHealth Sports Focus Centre State Games were discontinued after ten years, but Eaglehawk Club continued to organise Doubles Day for Croquet and Golf Croquet.

It was decided to have "no bake" dances instead of catering for dances at Spring Gully and St. Mark's.

All members paid a levy of \$5-00 twice a year.

The Borough Club sponsored our Club Championship Badges, Cystic Fibrosis trophies, and Anti-Cancer Days. The Borough Club also entertains our members at afternoon tea prior to Christmas.

Our Christmas lunches have been held at the Borough Club as part of our Christmas break-up.

Charity Day for Cystic Fibrosis was discontinued. Our thanks to Nell Mitchell, who organised these days for many years.

Six new plastic outdoor chairs and cushions were purchased.

2003: Interior painting of both rooms in the clubhouse cost \$1001-00.

Hoops were powder-coated at a cost of \$39-60.

Country Week was held in February. Section 2 games were played at Eaglehawk. Section 3 games were to be played on lawns decided upon by the VCA.

The levy for "no bake" dances was increased to \$10-00 per member per half-year.

Fees: Croquet \$65-00; Golf Croquet \$52-00; Restricted and Social fees to remain as previously determined. Green fees were increased to \$4-00 for a full day's play, and \$3-00 per half-day.

The worst drought in many years presented problems with watering the lawns. Fixed sprinklers were permitted at certain times. Later, sprinklers were banned, and hand-watering commenced.

2003 ctd.: Light falls of rain during the half-year were sufficient to keep the lawns watered.

Rod Kirk continued as our greenkeeper.

Students from the Secondary Colleges continue to come, and play Aussie Croquet instead of Golf Croquet.

The rental for the post-box increased to \$52-00 per year.

George Flack (Retire-Invest) continues to sponsor our Section 1 & 2 tournament, and the Golf Croquet tournament. Bendigo Bank sponsors the tournament for section 4. John Rainbow Tours have ceased their sponsorship, due to John Rainbow's ill-health.
