It might help

some of you make sense of death certificates (and burial places/names) you have for burials in the Bendigo area.

- $^{\star}$  In 1861 the Bishop of Melbourne consecrated the burial ground called the Back Creek Cemetery. So this was its original name.
- $\star$  In July 1871 it changed its name to Sandhurst Cemetery but I believe that there might have been the use of the old name for the cemetery for some time on death certificates.
- $^{\star}$  In 1892 the cemetery was renamed, Bendigo Cemetery, and has kept this name.

Interesting how cemeteries change their names over time. My thanks to both group of volunteers at Bendigo for their time and help.
