The present large Church was commenced in January, 1870, opened for use in May, and completed in 1873. Our first resident minister was appointed to the "Sandhurst" Circuit in 1860, the Rev. Richard Hart.

EARLY DAYS as PICTURED in our BAPTISM REGISTER.

The first entry is that of Elizabeth, daughter of George and Elizabeth Truill, father a miner of California Hill; the first little

resident of Golden Square to be Baptised was Caroline, (two months later, on July 22nd. 1860,) daughter of William (also a miner,) and Annitia Perry. During his three years of ministry, the Rev. Hart registered 132 Baptisms! Our latest entry (in a new Register, brought into use only last year,) is numbered 2615.

An idea of the area covered by the Golden Square pastorate in those days is given by the following list of babies' addresses, - California Hill, Lockwood, Spring Gully, (one from BALLAARAT.)

Eaglehawk, Golden Square, Long Gully, Kangaroo Flat, White Hills, Epsom, Shelbourne, Ravenswood, Axe Creek, Big Hill, Bullock Creekk, Sandhurst, Sheepshead Gully, Ironbark, Huntley, Sailor's Gully, and New Chum Gully.

Mr. Hart listed as occupations of the fathers, as would be expected, a great predominance of Miners, about 80; the other occupations were; carpenter, brickmaker, mason, blacksmith, store-keeper, puddler, merchant, labourer, cabdriver, shoemaker, engineer, reefer, bricklayer, quartz crusher, farmer (three only), butcher, schoolmaster, gardner, gentleman(!), baker, surgeon, brewer, digger, publican.
