Hawthorn tapestry for Bendigo church

The first tapestry hanging for a church in Australia has just come off its loom in Hawthorn.

Commissioned by the Sacred Heart Cathedral, Bendigo, the tapestry represents a year's spare-time-work – about 2,000 hours – for its designer and weaver, Mrs Sonya Carrington.

It is the first of two large hangings commissioned for the cathedral by Bishop Stewart. They will hang on the sanctuary walls behind the Bishop's throne.

Mrs Carrington, one of Australia's best known weavers, is taking the hanging to Bendigo this week.

"I will feel lost without it," she told Progress Press.

"I couldn't keep my fingers off it. Now I am eager to begin the second one."

She invited her local Member of Parliament, Mr Walter Jona, to see the tapestry when it was finished.

Mrs Carrington met him during the election campaign, and when she learned that Mrs Jona had originally come from Bendigo, asked if they would be interested to see the tapestry on its completion.

The Sacred Heart Cathedral in Bendigo, said to be the last great Cathedral to be built in the world, has been under construction for the past 77 years.

It was started in 1896, partly to give work to men unemployed after the gold rush, and the present Bishop of Sandhurst began the second stage in 1954.

The architects, Bates, Smart, and McCutcheon. contacted Mrs Carrington more than a year ago about the tapestries.

The second tapestry will show St Kilian, the patron saint of the first Roman Catholic Church in Bendigo. St Kilian's Church still stands.
