WE EXTEND A SINCERE WELCOME to all who have come to worship today. It is always our joy to welcome visitors Sunday by Sunday, and our prayer is that God will enrich every life.

THIS MORNING we share in a MEMORIAL SERVICE in honor of our beloved senior Life-Deacon; the late WALTER HUGH BEATON, who was called to higher service on Tuesday Morning, September 13th, after a lifetime of service for Jesus Christ; deeply associated with the Bendigo Baptist Church.

Mr. Beaton was born in Bendigo on November 22nd 1886, and was brought to Sunday School at the age of six years, by his parents. He went to Western Australia about 1901 and returned in 1909. In 1912, he was married to Annie Charlotte Riddell in our Hargreaves St Church, by the Rev. James Worboys, on March 20th.

Mr & Mrs Beaton were received into Membership on the 21st November 1915, and Mr Beaton was elected to the Diaconate on November 18th 1918. After 32 years of faithful service as a deacon, the Church bestowed upon him the honor of Life-Membership of the Diaconate on the 29th November 1950. In 1962 Mr & Mrs Beaton celebrated their Golden Wedding, and in November '65 had completed 50 years Membership of the Church. At the time of his 'Home-Call', he was in his 48th year as a Deacon; which was also his 16th as Life-Deacon. Highly esteemed and greatly loved, Mr Beaton has left an honored record in all places where he walked. His kindly smile and gracious encouragements won to himself friends along the highway of life, and wherever you may go, you will find those who revere his memory.

A lover of little children, who in turn loved him; is indelibly marked in the history of this Church by his 38 years as Sunday School Superintendent. His patience and love for the sick and afflicted is stamped by over 40 years visitation to the Hospitals in this City. His perennial youth is seen in a lifetime association with Christian Endeavour & Endeavourers, and his love for God and nature is seen in over 20 years devotion in decorating the Sanctuary with tokens of His handiwork. Time and space do not allow a complete resume of his tremendous life and work, but God above will reward him for his faithfulness and his love, and we thank God for every remembrance of Walter. H. 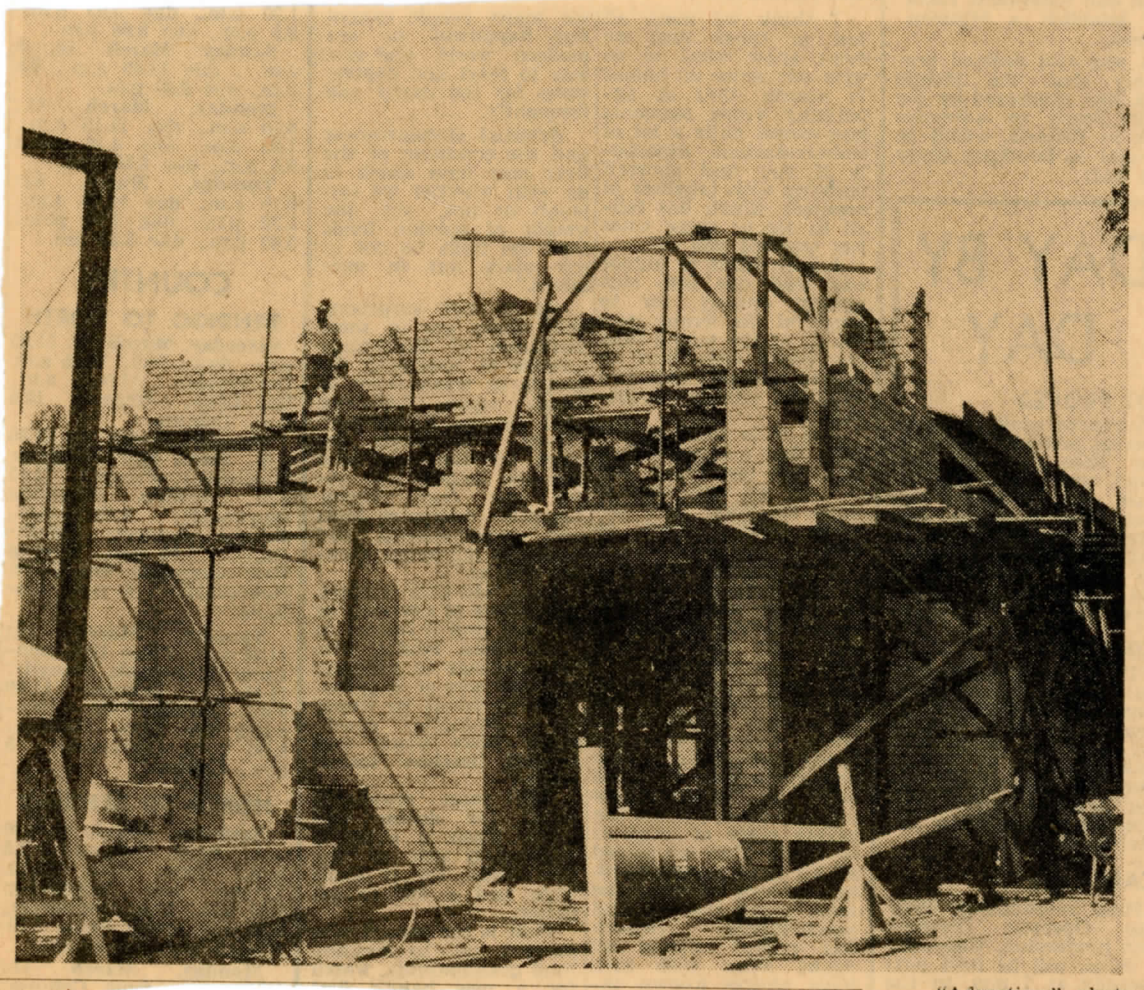

After 100 years of witness in Hargreaves St., the historic Bendigo Baptist Church will be used for worship for the last occasion at the weekend.

Celebrations will commence on Friday night, when the Sunday school scholars will present an 'Amateur Hour'.

The All-age Sunday School will meet at 9.30 a.m. on Sunday morning, and the worship service at 11 a.m. will be broadcast.

The guest preacher will be Rev. W. S. Hadden, L.Th., who ministered in the church from 1943 to 1950. In the afternoon at 2.30 a Christian Endeavour rally will be held in honor of the church's contribution to C.E. over the years. Rev. D. S. Breguet will be the preacher at the final service at 7 p.m. and a closing-down ceremony will be conducted from the church steps at 8.30 p.m.

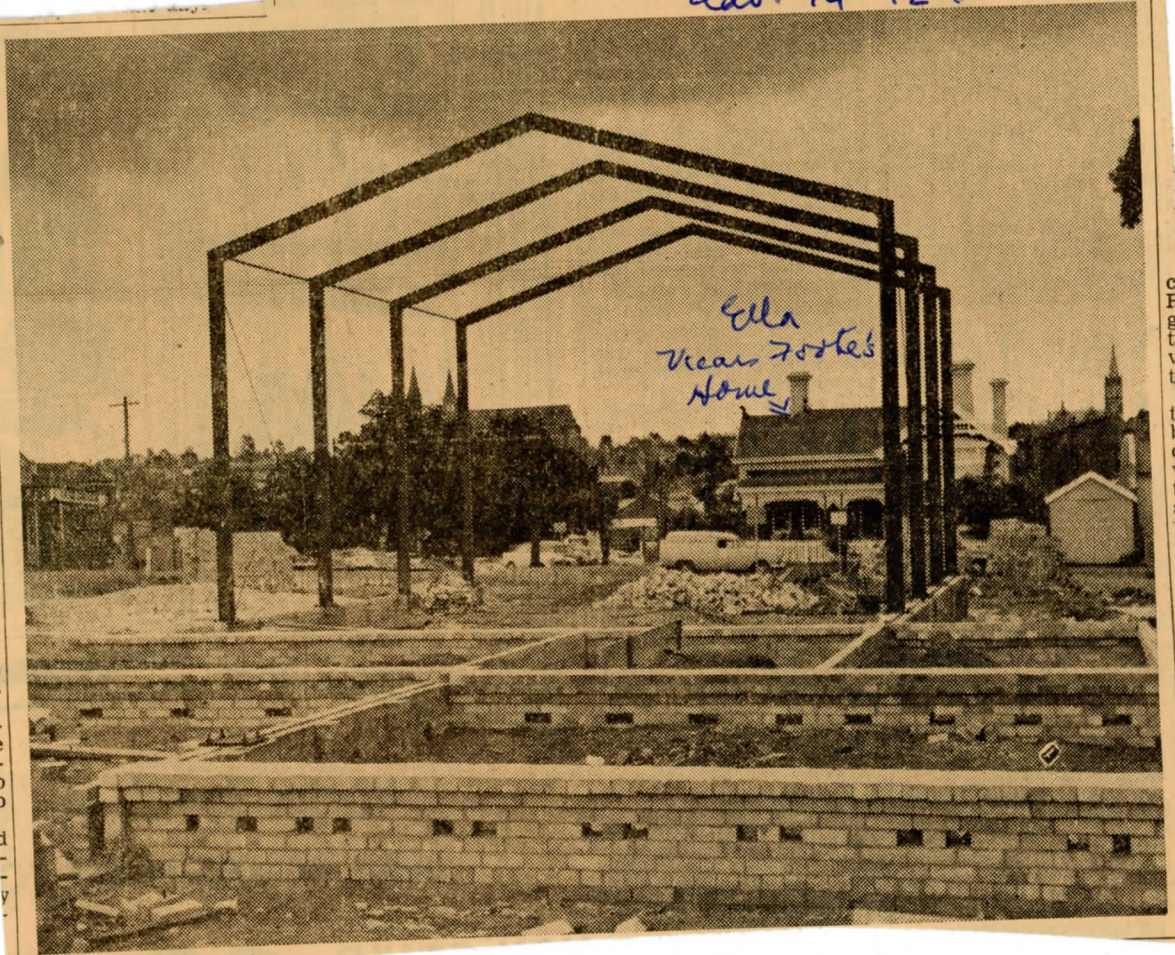
The new church in Edward St. is to be opened on August 3, and until then the church will receive temporary accommodation at the YWCA in High St.

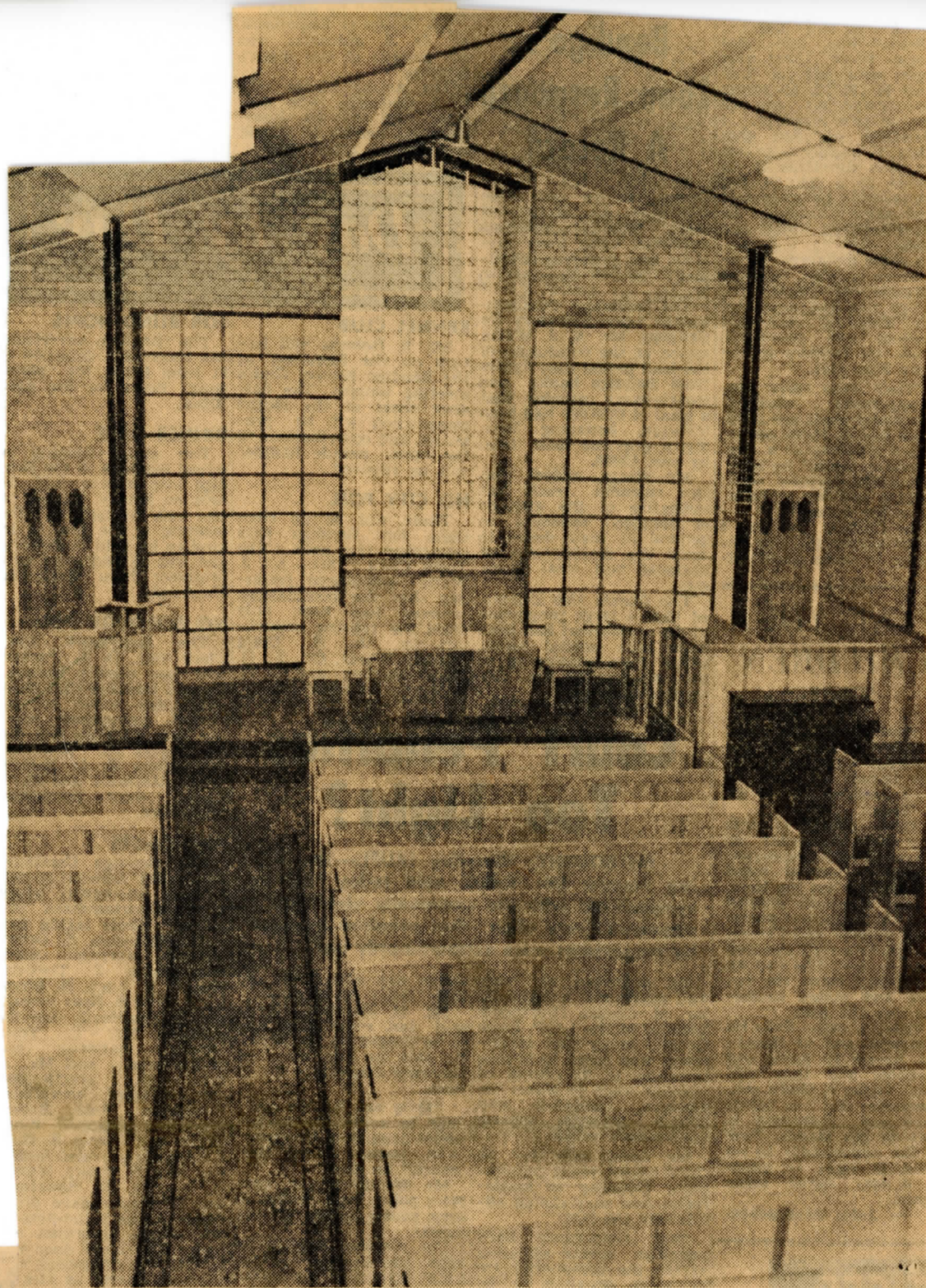

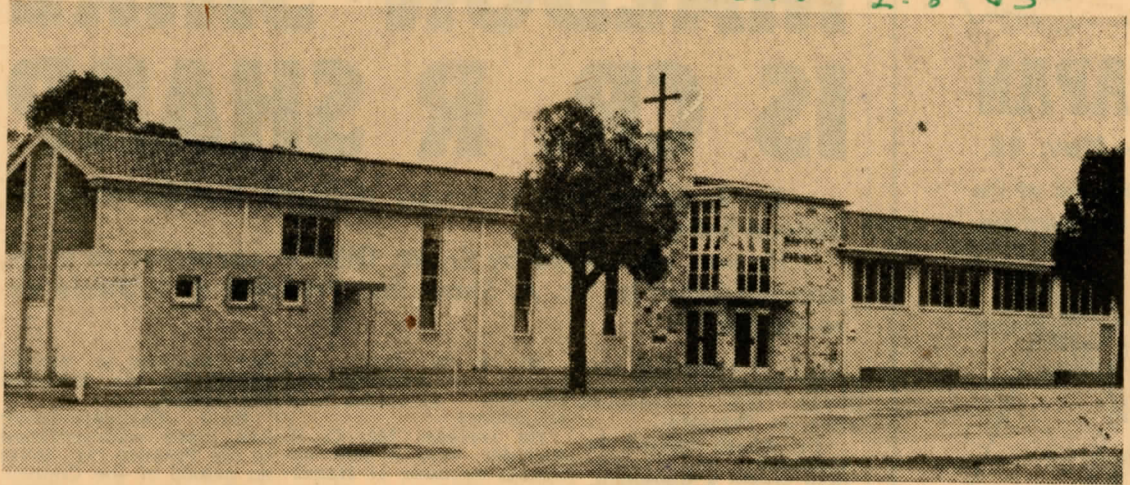

# CHURCH'S DESIGNER AS GUEST ORGANIST

When visiting Melbourne organist, Mr. Lawrence E. Warner, takes his place behind the organ in Bendigo's new Baptist Church on Sunday, it will be a special occasion for him.

As well as being the first guest organist in Bendigo's newest church — Mr. Warner, an architect, also designed the buildings.

Mr. Warner, who is the organist at Scots Church in Melbourne, will play a selection of sacred and classical items during the church's first "Pleasant Sunday Afternoon", beginning at 3 p.m.

The new Baptist Church, at the corner of Queen and Edward Streets, will be officially opened on Saturday with the handing over of the key to Mr. Walter Beaton, who is a Life Deacon of the church.

The guest speaker will be the President of the Baptist Union of Victoria, the Rev. John Morley.

## Electric Organ

The new Baptist Church, which can cater for a congregation of 220, has been built at a cost of £35,000, including furniture and fittings. Building began last November.

One of the outstanding features is the new Hammond electric organ, which church officials say is the first of its kind in Bendigo.

The church secretary, Mr. Hedley R. White, said yesterday that the new church was the result of many years of planning, which began with the purchase of land in 1954.

The previous Baptist Church, in Hargreaves St., has now been demolished.

The new church is of the latest design. A central foyer, surrounded by a stone-faced tower and Cross, leads into both the church and hall, with a stairway leading to the Young People's room, which takes in the width of the building.

## Tiled Baptistry

The focal point in the sanctuary is the raised, tiled, open Baptistry. Behind it is a large window with a pattern of bricks and a Cross, throwing a large shadow across the interior.

The Young People's room upstairs provides facilities for showing films and indoor sports. It has a stage and dressing rooms, and leading off the main hall are a well-equipped kitchen and nursery, primary

and kindergarten departments.

Bendigo's new Baptist Church will be the centre for most of the congregation in the district. The nearest Baptist Churches are at Eaglehawk and White Hills.

The first constituted Baptist Church was opened in Bendigo in 1859.

The Minister of the new church is the Rev. D. S. Breguet, who has been in charge since February.

He will preach the evangelistic service on Sunday at 7 p.m.

Invitations to Saturday's opening ceremony have been sent to civic and political identities.

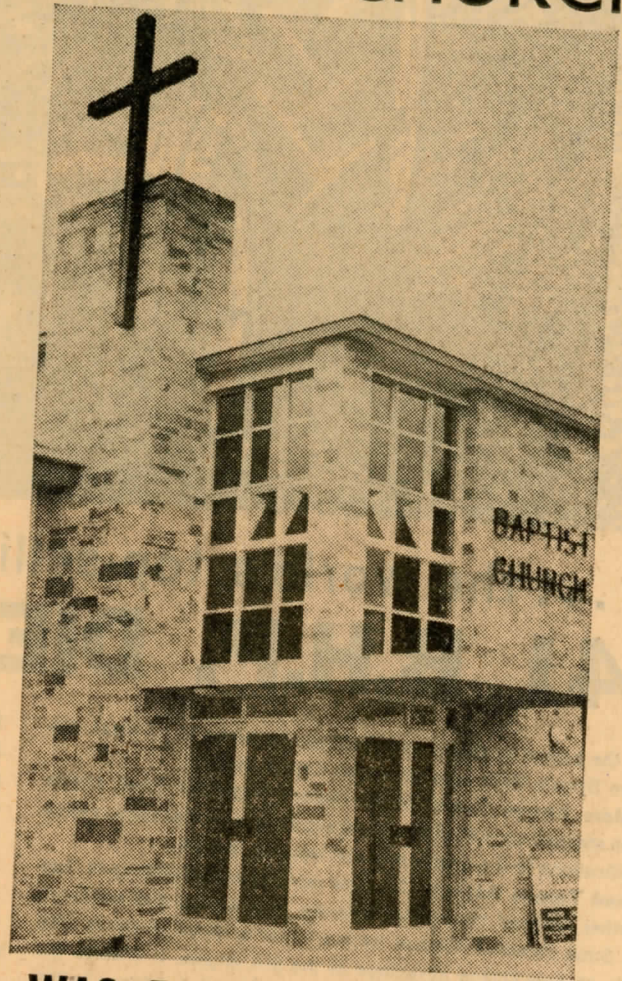

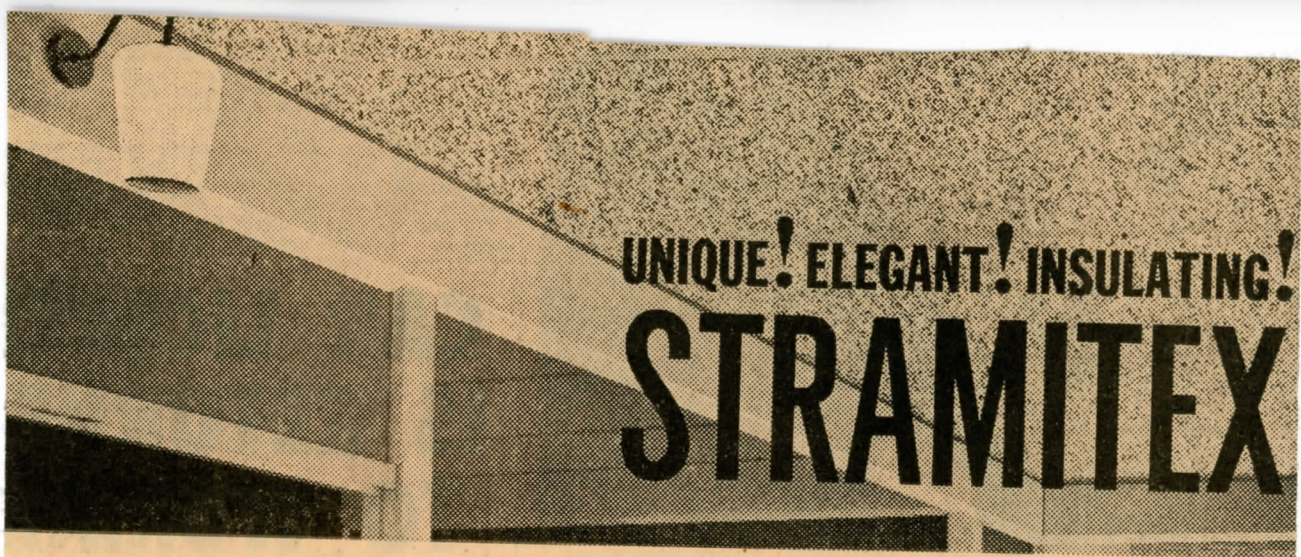

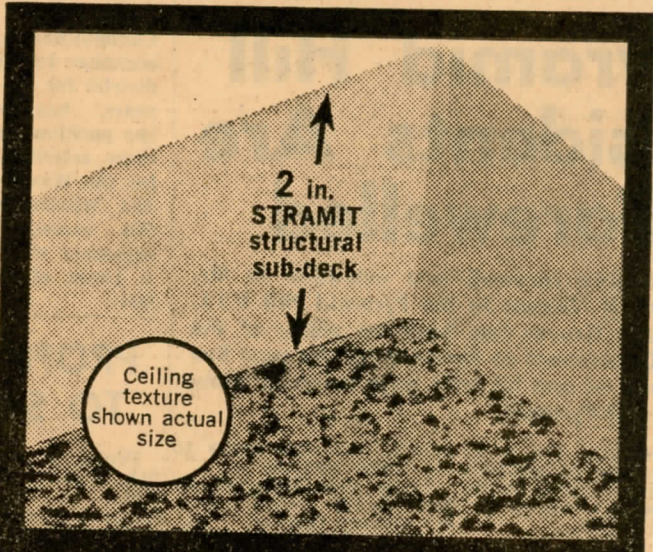
