The preliminary lecture paved the way for those who were not well acquainted with the intricacies of a Bach fugue. Last night she brought out the polyphonic beauties of two Bach preludes and fugues with deep understanding, faultless technique and musical insight.

These were followed by the Variations and Fugue on a Theme of Handel by Brahms—a masterly per-formance and one of the highlights of the evening.
