The profound visual and literary impressions made by the Swiss and Italian landscapes on the young composer are reflected in these pieces, which, in spite of the passage of time, have lost neither their freshness and originality, nor their power of evoking that mood of melancholy, sometimes tender, sometimes tragic, which was typical of the composer of this period.
