Orlando Gibbons (1583-1625) was one of a noted family of musicians: born at Cambridge, he was recognised as one of the finest organists and greatest musical geniuses of England; his reputation as a composer will ever rest on his magnificent Church music, which for fine harmony and simple solemn grandeur stands unexcelled. His madrigals are among the best of the English schools. The one presented to you this evening is written for six voices and contains five distinct subjects or themes; each theme, in true madrigal fashion, being consecutively, but never collectively, sung by each voice, and it is this quality (especially nucleoslic in the concluding theme with its successive outbursts of "Hosanna in the highest heavens") which makes the madrigal of such compelling interest.
