INSTRUCTION TICKETS.

Private Lessons Tickets, 2/6 each.

Ladies and Gentlemen desirous of taking Private Lessons between the Sessions can obtain Tickets for the purpose at the Skate Ticket Office, or in Books of **10 for £1.** These Tickets entitle purchasers to Tuition from the Instructors (by appointment, between Sessions only) at four different intervals during the hour.

Fancy Skating (Professor's Tickets), 4/- each

can be obtained at the Skate Ticket Window, or in Books of **for £1**. These Tickets entitle purchasers to Special Instruction by one of the Professors (by appointment) on three or four occasions, either between or during Session.

Tickets should **NOT** be given up to Instructors until holders have received the Instruction specified above.
