It is understood that the Attomey-General is desirous of ascertaining details of organizations who are in a position to substantially comply with the provisions of the Will of the late Amy M.J.M.Gwilym and I respectfully submit the following Informetion in reference to the Bendigo and District Historical Society.

The Society has been in operation for many years and was reconstituted last year and the Society and its Committee now hate the full support of the Bendigo City Council. The Writer, Who is at present Mayor of the City, is the President of the Society.

The Society already holds hundreds of articles of historical interest and many more are to be handed to the Society as soon as the proposed buildings are available for exbibition purposes.

The buildings (the old Police Barracks) are at present occupied by the Educatidn Department but are unsuitable for this purpose and prefrabricated classrooms are already in course of erection and when completed the old buildings will be handed to the socioty. The Society already has the necessary display cases for exhibiting the articles handed to it.

For your information I enclose copy of the constitution and rules of the society setting out fully the objects and in this regard would point out that Bendigo is the centre of the Goldfields in which Maryborough is situated and the history of Bendigo is also to a large extent the history of Maryborough.

If funds could be made available from the above Trust my Committee vould undertake in addition to the main collection to make a roor available whinh would be called the "Gwilym Room" and to only exhibit ther由in articles which would be of pomemargan interestato residents of the Maryborough District.
