Dear Sir,

It is requested please that application be made to the Education Department to enable the Bendigo Historical Society to occupy the Police Barracks in Rosalind Park as an Historical Museum.

The Council will appreciate that the building is an historical one in the City. It is ideally situated to be used as an Historical Museum.

It is at present used as a classroom by the High School - one room only - the remainder of the building being used as a dump by the Public Works Department - and is being knocked about.

The Board of Inspectors of the Education Department has recommended that it be no longer used as a Classroom and that a new pre-fabricated unit be provided for the High School. Even pending this permission the Historical Society would be grateful for the use of the other rooms to store & display Historical relics now coming forward whilst the High School could continue to use the present classroom.

The Historical Society will undertake to repair and maintain the building in good condition as a clause of its occupancy.
