Charles Washington Reynolds married Amelia Munroe in 1853 At St. Kilda Victoria Reg. 1465 In 1856 a son Alban Reynolds was born, reg. 4275

In 1858 Louis Charles Reynolds was born in St. Kilda- parents Charles Washington Reynolds and Amelia Reynolds nee Munro. Reg. 10985. This child survived for two months Death St. . Kilda 1858 reg. 6051

In 1859 Louisa Ann is born reg. No. 12258

In 1861 another son named Charles was born to the above parents reg. 19442. This child survived for three years and died at St. Kilda in 1864 reg. 8782.

Another daughter, Ellen Amelia is born in 1867 - reg. No. 5009

It is interesting to note that our Grandfather Charles Albon Reynolds was born in 1862 (in Bendigo) and had a sister named Amelia and another sister named Louisa. His father was Richard Reynolds son of Alban.

My mother Amelia, informed me that her father used to visit on occasions, she thought it was a cousin, who lived in St. Kilda and had some involvement with the St. Kilda Baths. Was Chas. Albon Reynolds named Chas. in 1862, after Charles Washington Reynolds? Was Amelia Reynolds named after Amelia Munro? We now know that the first child of Richard Reynolds and Eleanor Hinde was named Richard after the father and Croom after John Croom, Richard's half brother. John Croom and Charles Washington Reynolds were in Victoria before Richard Reynolds arrived in 1856, also here was John Napoleon Reynolds.

Richard Reynolds migrated with the promise of a position in the "Mint" which was still to be built. Richard arrived in Victoria 12th Dec.1856 on the "George Marshall" a ship wrecked on Flinders Island some years later. Charles Washington Reynolds married in 1853 at St. Kilda, his arrival date not known.

The marriage certificate of Charles and Amelia should give parents names.

If located, death certificate of Charles Washington Reynolds should show the names of his children and also his parents' names.
