B/F no. 5502 At two years of age she suffered a fall and was left with a limp. Her Mother advised her that she was not strong and that she should never marry. Her occupation was a tailoress and she lived to ninety-five years. She grew up in Bendigo, lived most of her life in St.Kilda and in her last years lived for a while in Auburn and died in Cheltenham Home 13th May 1960 and was buried in Spring Te Vic. d/f 5829 Spring Vale. She had a friend called George and when George died she was sad and said they had been engaged for forty years.

She had a good sense of humour and with her black hair and blue eyes would have been good looking in her youth She supported herself with her sewing, well into her eighties. She had a generous nature In 1958 she made Dirkjan his first short tailored trousers.

She was then ninety-two years of age.

She was named Mary after her maternal grandmother and Eleanor after either her Mother or her paternal grandmother. Or both.
