He enlisted in the First World War 19<sup>th</sup> August 1914.

Raymond was a Stretcher Bearer, Second Field Ambulance, First Division.

Honours and Award, Commendations

Raymond G.Reynolds won a Military Medal for Conspicuous Bravery at Bour- France.

Twenty four hours under Shell Fire in sight of enemy on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup>

M.M. 12.4.1917

Raymond does not appear to have returned to Australia. It is believed he married an English girl, in London. It is unknown whether he had a family.

Further research is needed for Raymond G. Reynolds.

Notes on his siblings. Sister Thelma married but died young no children.

Noel was married and had four or five children lived Melbourne.

Sidney - nothing known. James was a batchelor.

Except Raymond the family all lived in Victoria.

John Softlaw born 26<sup>th</sup> June 1759 Shoreditch London England.  
Parents of John Softlaw - Benjamin Softlaw and Martha

Eleanor married John Croom 25<sup>th</sup> February 1806 - 23 years  
London - St. Andrews by the Wardrobe Ref. IGI c17
