The pair of Gold Spec-
tacles enclosed in a case with Gold
plate and Inscriptions - Presented to
Mr. D. J. Wright Foreman of the Typing
Type Founders Firm
Employed in the
in the service of that firm - had
been presented at a Meeting in the
Shop of the Whole of the Men poor
Mr Wright was almost moved to
tears he did not know what to
say in reply Mr Wright has also
got for his likeness a photograph
painted in Oil and placed in a Gilt
Frame and then enclosed in a gla-
ss case to keep it
clean and hung up in one of the

Shops to be kept as a Memoriam
for ever 150 Cante's were also
taken for the Men one of which
I send to you thinking you would
like to have one in remembrance
of him
