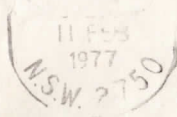
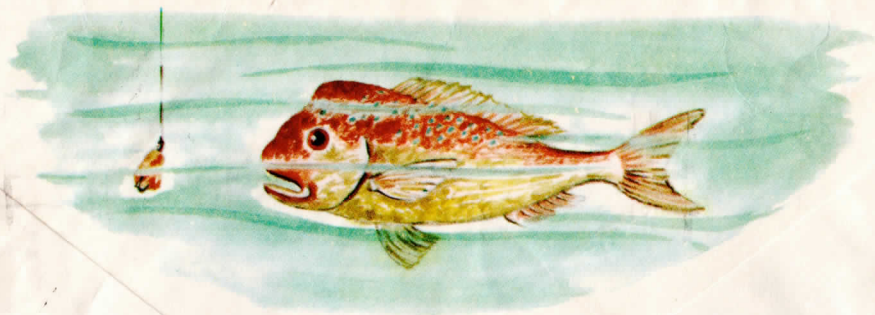

(Continued from post card) The mountains sparkle like mirrors  
because of the rocks in them, such as jasper, Agate, etc so they  
were called Glasshouse Mountains. Which the name has  
not been changed. There is a big number of Victorians up  
here, today I met Roy Luke, who owns the Buntleigh  
Bus lines and his in No. 1 Norcliff Flats. We spent  
three weeks No 8 at Norcliff Flats, & then our booking  
ran out so we shifted to a street at the back of the  
Mooloolaba shopping center. It is a splendid  
flat and is only eight guineas a week, but it has no  
view but we are just one minute from the beach.  
Glad has it & is a right as a bowler, and has  
left me well behind. I meant to tell you that Mr  
Dahl, aged about fifty made a fortune out of  
sugar cane, so he built a block of flats costing  
about fifty thousand, and retired with his nest egg.  
He and his wife live about three miles away at  
Buderim and Mr Dahl comes down each day to  
look after his flats. There is about one dozen  
bawling queens in this area. We get the Melbourne Sun  
at 2 o'clock each day. Yesterday the plane could not  
get through because of the fog at Albury and we did  
not get our Monday SUN till nine o'clock this morning.
