MINUTES OF GENERAL MEETING HELD AT BALLARATON 27/9/75.

Meeting opened 9.35 pm. - R. KENTER in the chair.

MATTERS ARISING:

APPLICATION FEES FOR V.A.V.A. Moved R. KENTER, Seconded A. LOWE that
\$2394.00 be forwarded to the V.A.V.A. along
with the registration list. CARRIED.

A. LOZENICINS EXPENSES - WANGARATTA, JUNE '75.

Moved R. KENTER, Seconded M. MANSFIELD
that \$20.00 be paid to A. Lozenicins as
expenses for refereeing the finals at
the Country Championships in June. CARRIED.

V.C.V.C. CONSTITUTION DRAFT.

It was resolved that Mr. T Stevens of
Bendigo Assn. be requested to draft a
constitution & by laws for the V.C.V.C.
The draft should be distributed to affiliated
associations ready for consideration during
March '76. CARRIED.

ASIAN CHAMPIONSHIP MATCHES.

A. Lowe gave a report of the Match conducted in Warrnambool. A very successful
night, even with the problems of liasion and the weather. About 1200 witnessed
the match.

M. Mansfield gave a report on the Match held in Bendigo. As with Warrnambool, it
was very successful. About 750 people saw the match. M. Mansfield also briefly
reported on the championships generally. There were many problems, mainly with
co-ordination of services and liasion, but felt that no other state could have done
better. The effect of the series on the public was over whelming and overall must be
regarded as very successful.

M. Mansfield moved that a letter of congratulations be forwarded to the Organizing
Committee and the V.A.V.A. for their foresight and promotion of Volleyball
over the Asian Championships. CARRIED.

CORRESPONDENCE. All correspondence since last meeting was read and accepted.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

PETTY CASH FOR SECRETARY. Moved M. MANSFIELD that \$30.00 be advanced to the
Secretary for Petty Cash. Sec. J. DEWAR SECONDED.

INTER ASSOCIATION MATCHES. J. Dewar raised the suggestion of playing a regular competition or knockout series between country associations. Following discussion it was felt that it would be more beneficial to have two or three associations getting together to play matches.

POSSIBLE STATE COACH; The proposal for the appointment of a State Coach by the V.A.V.A. in 1976 was discussed. It was felt that the most benefit would be obtained by seeking the services of an overseas experienced coach to coach at higher levels, rather than one who would be responsible for teaching basics to school children.

STANDARDIZATION OF COUNTRY TOURNAMENTS.

Moved D. Watson - Seconded J. Dewar that "In all time limit matches, an unfinished game will only count towards the result of the match or towards the calculation of percentage if the score of at least one of the teams has reached eight and leads the other team by at least 2 points.

All matches are to be best of 5 is time permits.

e.g. 7 -4 not counted.

8 -6 (won game)

10 -9 (Drawn Game)
