

#### FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 1

A wall calendar showing 20 to 26 Tradesmen Advertisers around a central date chart with such other useful information as a local area requires  
Based on 24 @ \$30 each \$ 720.00 gross  
less cost of printing 3000 copies 300.00 estimated  
Net profit \$ 420.00

Each contributor is handed a share of calendars for distribution. To be most successful it helps to have all the advertisers in the one Town or Suburb. Profit will vary on cost of printing.

#### FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 2

A trust fund is established of \$100,000.00 by 100 people at \$1000 each. The fund is invested on first mortgage returning (at current rates) \$12,000. Provision is made that each contributor can have his \$1000 on giving reasonable notice (say 3 months). It is possible that 10% of the fund can be collected in from all the different Associations throughout Victoria and sub-groups of 10 could pool \$100 each to form a single unit in the scheme.

At this stage it would be of great benefit if the reserves of all Associations could be made known. There is no attempt to take these reserves so it would defeat the purpose if the figures are not supplied.

#### FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 3

All Associations or related bodies holding funds in Bank accounts with no immediate plans for the use thereof forward same to the VAVA for holding in trust. The VAVA will then invest same at 12% and credit interest at the rate of 6% to the Donor. The funds will be available to the donor when required.

Example - If \$10,000 is obtained in this way the revenue for VAVA would be \$600.00 per annum.

I emphasize that this scheme would have no disadvantages to the Donors as their capital would be recoverable.

#### FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 4

A Miss Volleyball contest with each Association or related bodies providing an entrant. This should produce at least ten entrants.

Make each entrant produce a sponsorship of \$100.00. Result \$1000 plus possible publicity. A reasonable prize would be required and possibly Ansett could provide a Holiday package at a budget figure of \$200.00 leaving a net figure of \$800.00.

This scheme again has a double edged result as each sponsorship group can keep what it raises over and above the \$100.00 entry fee.

FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 5

Arrange for a program of "Adopt a Player" whereby each of the 72 State team players obtains a separate sponsor. Using current figures of Annual State team requirements of \$3600 the individual sponsorship represents \$50.00. Possible sponsors could be Rotary, Jaycees, Lions, or School Groups. A very active sub-committee would be required but it would not be impossible.

FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO.6

"Best Beard" is a popular contest with each entrant paying anything from \$1.00 to \$5.00 and a prize being supplied in proportion to entrant and entry fees. This could also be on a regional and share with clubs proposition. Expected revenue on an example basis is -

State League 305 registered senior men - say 200 enter at \$2.00 each

NOTE: These figures take no account of outside entries which could increase the results considerably.

FUND RAISING PROPOSAL NO. 7

"Little Tattslotto"

Groups of 40 units are sold at \$1.00 each with luck number being the supplementary number drawn in true Tattslotto. Prize \$20.  
Net profit \$20.00 per each 40 tickets sold.
