## COUNTRY VOLLEYBALL - WHERE TO ?

Many changes have been mooted for the future, and in fact the winds of change have already started to blow in 1980.

I shall not go into great detail as to the proposed State League for 1981, but from much discussion and opinions these are my thoughts.

A State League needs to happen, but Associations need to give much thought to the organising, structure and financing of their representative squads. Four months of activity playing at least 18 matches and training many hours could drain the enthusiasm of many players, so forward planning to counter this is a must - don't just enter, and expect everything to fall into place. My Association (Port Augusta) is all set to impliment plans, because they foresee problems.

The State League must not run more than four months.

Four away trips, with teams being grouped at various centres should be the aim.

Travel will be the biggest cost - teams can cut down considerably in accomodatic costs if they bunk in caravans. I would estimate that \$1000 could finance seniors squads for away games. Your Association should get down with your squads with the aim tho fund raise and finance the players so that nothing will come out of their pockets for travel and accomodation for away games.

The under 17 section must take place earlier in the year so that school exams and study won't be effected. Perhaps regional play off could be arranged with the winners foring a play off section.

We must support the basis that if you don't field junior teams, your senior teams will not be eligible to participate. There must be no half measures.

A word of paise to the host Association, Whyalla.- except for a few minor problems early on, their organisation could not be faulted. They certainly played their part in making everyone feel most welcome.

The Country titles for 1981 will be held in Adelaide on the June long weekend.

There will be three DIVISIONS-

DIVISION 1. Pt. Pirie, Whyalla, Pt. Augusta, Broken Hill, Mt. Gambier.

DIVISION 2. Second teams from the above mentioned Associations

DIVISION 3. Clare, Riverland, and smaller Associations.

Might I mention that when third division teams become strong enough, they ill earn promotion.

MENS B DIVISION.

One top rated player virtually decided the issue in Whyalla's favour, and it all happened by chance.

Andrew Ibbotson arrived at the Stadium on Saturday morning not intending to play, but he fronted up when his team was left short. Throughout the weekend, Andrew dictated Whyalla's fortunes. They lost just one game, and went on to win the final from Broken Hill in very easy fashion.

Broken Hill were surprise packets, but when it came to the crunch, they lacked the ability to successfully tackle Whyalla.

Port Augusta showed early promise, but they fell by the wayside because of injury, weariness, and becoming unsettled by umpiring decisions.

Port Pirie fielded a useful team and only needed a few breaks to go their way and they would have been in the final. Their big moment of the weekend was their defeat of Whyalla in a minor round match.

Clare and Riverland had little to celebrate, but again they should benefit by the experience. Next year, the proposed DIVISION three will give these smaller Associations a lease of life.
