A PROPOSAL
FOR THE DEVELOPMENT
OF VICTORIAN VOLLEYBALL
LEAGUE

1. INTRODUCTION

This proposal is a research document into expansion of volleyball for the State of Victoria following consultation with clubs both country and metropolitan, it was obvious that people at the local and regional level did not have adequate input into volleyball development policy at the State level.

It was also obvious that at club and regional level, clubs did not have established mechanism through which such input could be channelled. Therefore it is anticipated that the programme will be established throughout Victoria to facilitate:-

(1) co-ordination and development of volleyball at the club level.

(11) provide a mechanism through which metropolitan clubs and regional associations may have input into volleyball development policy at the state level.

Objective of such a programme will be to have greater control by having direct communication with small groups of clubs. Programme can then be adjusted to suit local needs.

2. FUNCTIONS

If we accept a principle that for any programme to be successful, it must start from the base unit, then the club will be first one where the programme will apply.

The following list of functions are suggested:-

1. Divide V.V.L. clubs into zones for which each club will be directly responsible. Zones will include -
 - (a) local government
 - (b) newspaper network
 - (c) schools
 - (d) other volleyball clubs
2. To plan, monitor and co-ordinate the development of volleyball promotion programme within a defined area.
3. To provide an opportunity for clubs to develop joint ventures.
4. To co-ordinate the conduct of courses for sports coaches and sports administrators.
5. To make community more aware of volleyball.
6. Form advisory committee.

3. STRUCTURE OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE

It is suggested that the advisory committee have a two tier structure. The creation of a reasonable large assembly that is representative of all V.V.L. clubs. This committee will formulate objectives and promotion programme. It will elect within sub-committee which will monitor and implement the programme. The main advisory committee will then disband.

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1. Advisory Committee

- (1) Comprise of one representative of each V.V.L. club.
- (2) other representatives nominated by V.A.V.A.
- (3) executive promotion officer.

2. Advisory Sub-Committee

The Advisory Sub-Committee to consist of:-

- 1 chairman
- 1 deputy chairmen
- 1 secretary
- 2 other members

Desirably, the chairman of the advisory sub-committee will be a member of V.A.V.A. Executive Committee, and the remaining members drawn from membership of Advisory Committee or interested people co-opted because of their interest and expertise.


The Advisory Sub-Committee would look after the day to day operations of the development programme, the frequency of meetings would depend on how active the sub-committee was and what projects were being undertaken.

4. DEFINING REGIONAL BOUNDARIES

The term "zones" has been used loosely so people interested in forming advisory committee, may define the area themselves. It is proposed that regional association itself be responsible for implementation of the development programme, having the V.V.L. Club as the focus point in programme promotion.

5. RELATIONSHIP TO THE V.A.V.A.

Obviously, communication lines will have to be established between Advisory Sub-Committee and V.A.V.A. Advisory Sub-Committee will report to V.A.V.A. Executive Committee at the frequency determined by V.A.V.A.
