VENUE: WARRNAMBOOL YMCA STADIUM, QUEENS ROAD, WARRNAMBOOL.

On behalf of the Warrnambool YMCA Volleyball Association, I would like to thank the V.A.V.A. for allowing our Association the opportunity to host these Championships.

Notices of the forthcoming Championships were distributed to all schools, clubs and Associations throughout Victoria in early July. Entry forms were then forwarded out in early August with the closing date for entries on September 8th.

10 Girls teams and 15 Boys teams entered, far exceeding last years entries.

Working out the draw proved to be a real headache when we realized the only way to work the boys draw was to put them into 3 pools. Never having had to work out a 3 pool system before, we tried to contact the Executive Director, V.A.V.A. for some guidelines, however, he was unavailable so we went ahead and worked it out to the best of our ability but unfortunately this did not comply with requirements. We were quite upset when told on the Saturday afternoon of the Championships that the boys pools finals would have to be changed. We would have appreciated it more had we been warned beforehand that this change would have to take place.

The games themselves were of an exceptionally high standard and although courts did get behind at times everything ran smoothly. The games ended up running 55 minutes late overall on the Saturday night.

The 4 courts in the Stadium were used to full advantage plus 1 court at the Christain Brothers College.

Recommendation: That next year (1985) the Association hosting these Championships would need at least 6 courts, maybe even 7 within close proximity of one another and a copy of the guidelines sent to them.

We would like to thank all Association, Club and School teams who participated, particularly those who had to travel very long distances (we quite understand the distance worries). We would also like to commend all the players, coaches and referees for the manner in which the games were played. Also congratulations to the winning teams.

State volleyball championships set for this weekend

The Victorian under 17 boys and girls volleyball championships will be played in Warrnambool this weekend.

This is only the second year the championships have been held with metropolitan and country divisions.

Victorian Amateur Volleyball Association executive director, Mr Bob Rowe, told local officials he was delighted with the response to this year's championship considering it was being held in the country.

There will be five more teams competing this year than participated at the first championship in Melbourne last year.

Warrnambool will be represented for the first time with a team in each section.

The boys section, of 15 teams, will be split into three pools with each side playing four games plus finals.

There are 10 teams divided into two pools in the girls championship.

Five courts - four at the YMCA stadium and one at CBC - will be in use.

Games will start at 8 a.m. on Saturday and finish about 11 p.m.

Further games will be played on Sunday before the girls final at noon and the boys at 1.30 p.m.

All finals will be at the stadium.

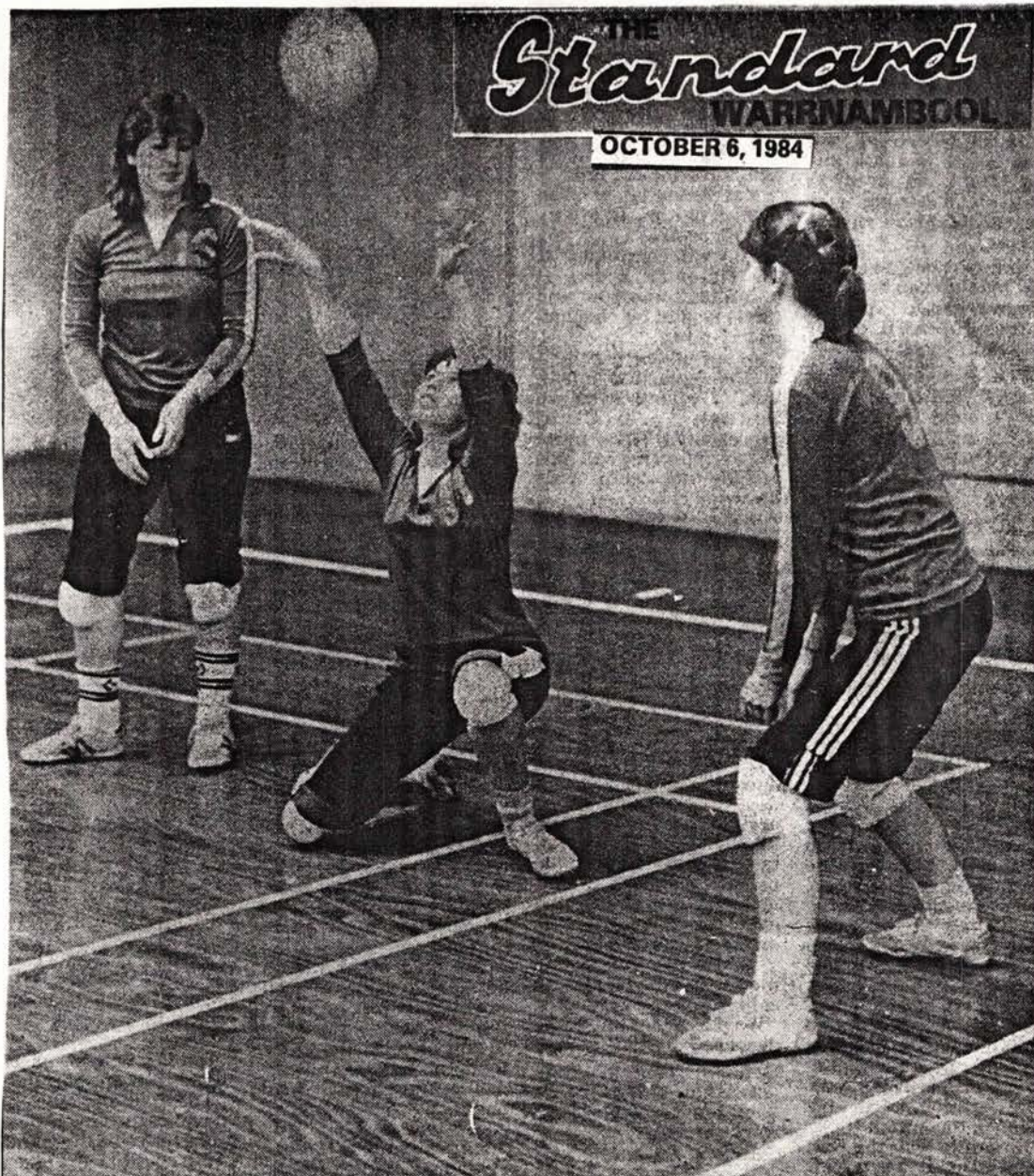

Volleyball team's full of confidence

Warrnambool is anticipating reaching the final of the girls, state under 17 teams volleyball championship on its home courts this weekend, despite this being its first major tournament.

Coach Ann Oakley said the Warrnambool team had three state representatives as its nucleus.

Although the side is yet to prove itself in competition, she said Warrnambool was confident of heading its pool with the chance of playing tournament favorite Bendigo in the final.

Sharon Hicks, Jodie Dalton and Sandra Hand have all represented Victoria at under 15 and 17 level.

Sandra Hand was also a member of the successful Victorian High Schools team at the Australian championship.

Warrnambool has a squad of 10 players and although some girls are only 13 or 14, most have experience in open competition locally.

Warrnambool's toughest opponent in the four games to be played at the Indoor Stadium today is likely to be Fairhills High, which has a reputation for turning out good vollyballers.

Bendigo is a proven competition combination and should have little trouble heading the second pool of five teams.

Warrnambool also has a boys' team entered in the championship.

With 15 teams, the boys' section has been divided into three pools.

Play will start at 8 a.m. today and finish at 11 p.m. The girls' final will be at noon tomorrow and the boys, at 1.30 p.m.

The Warrnambool girls side will play Goulburn Valley at 8 a.m., Nomads at 11 a.m., Fairhills at 3.30 p.m., and Frankston at 8 p.m.

The boys play Horsham at 11 a.m., Goulburn Valley at 2 p.m., Morwell at 6.30 p.m., and St Johns at 9.30 p.m.

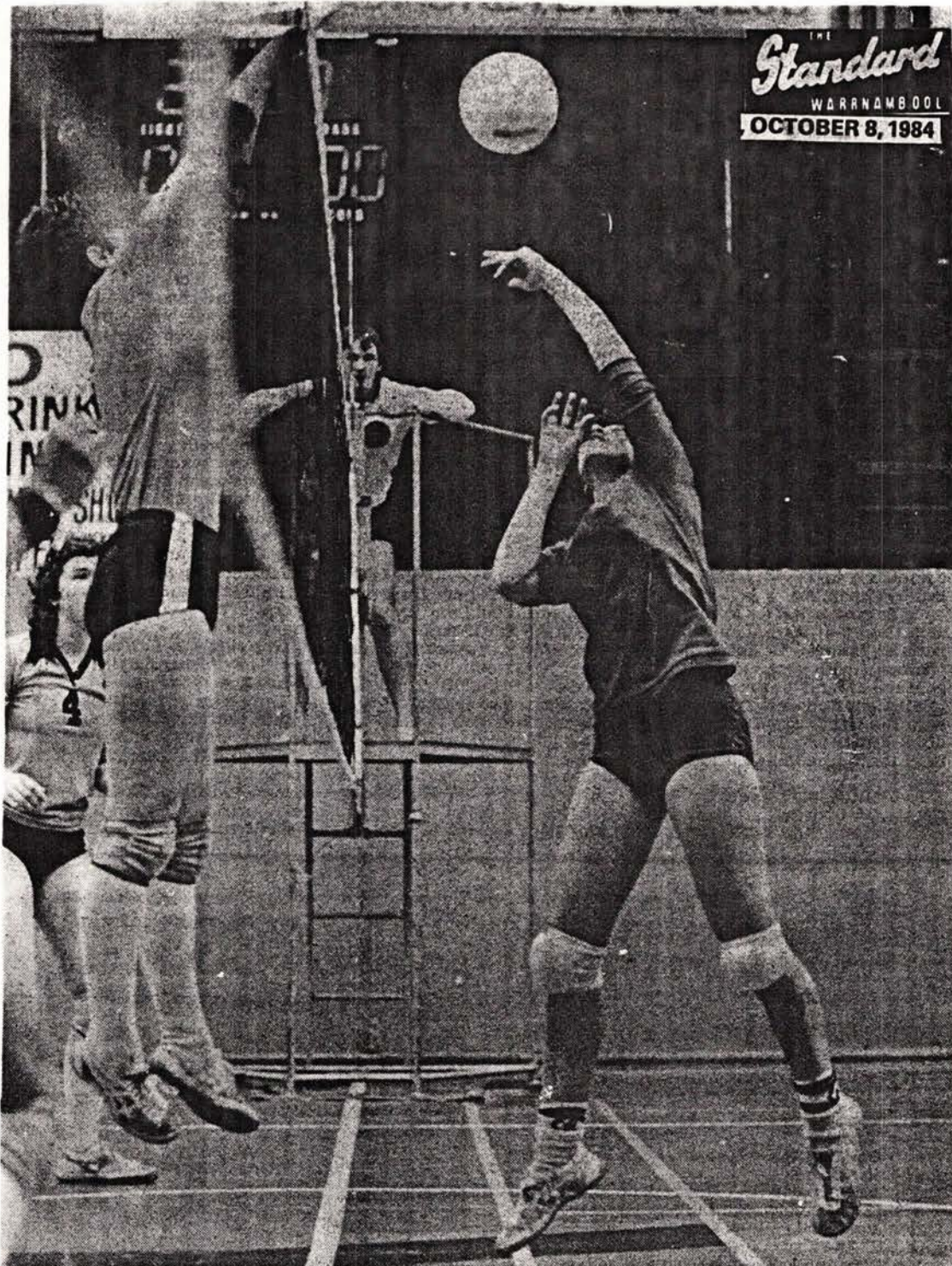

Gallant in defeat

Warrnambool's under 17 girls' team failed to take the Victorian State Volleyball Championship yesterday when it was beaten in the grand final by Bendigo.

Playing at the YMCA stadium the team went down 15-12, 15-8, 10-15, 15-2, despite being undefeated before the final.

Warrnambool's Sandra Hand played well throughout the tournament leading the team to wins over Normands, Goulburn

Valley, Fairhills and Frankston in the opening round.

With a good win over Upwey in the semi final the team went into the final with a good chance of taking the State championship from the strong Bendigo team.

Warrnambool struggled in the grand final with Bendigo's height being a telling factor on the vital points.

Bendigo won a close first set, before easily taking the second set. Then Warrnambool found top gear, bouncing back to take the third.

Despite good form from captain Sharon Hicks and the consistent Sandra Hand Bendigo wrapped up the fourth set and the championship.

In the boys under 17 state championship, Frankston defeated Bendigo 12-15, 15-5, 16-14, 15-13.

Warrnambool failed to make the final after being beaten by Frankston in the semi final.

Best players for Warrnambool in the semi finals were Chris Walker and Dean Fary.

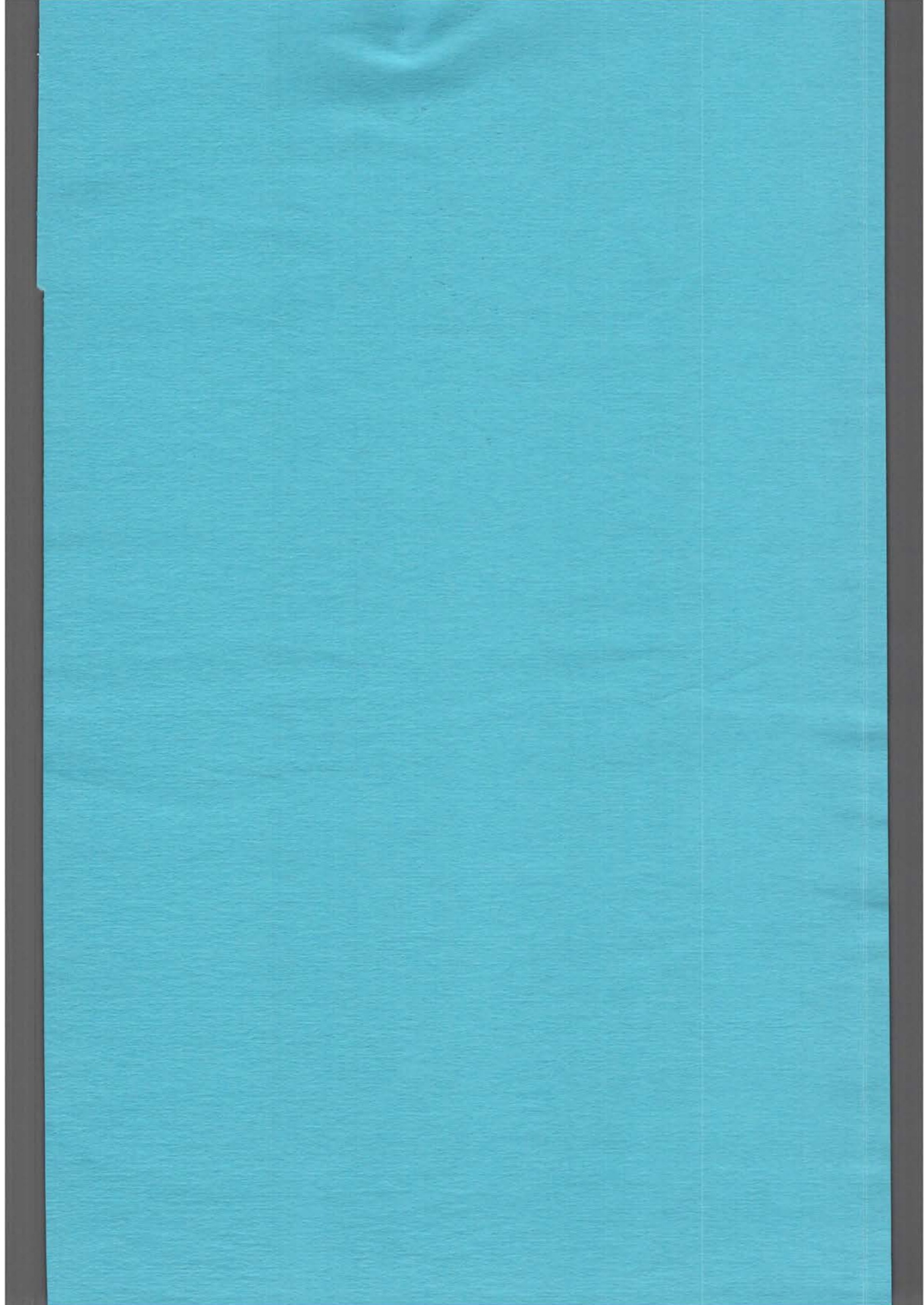
