RULES!! The referee's Commission has asked me to spread the word and hopefully clear up some of the current confusion over the 'new rules' and their interpretation. There have been a number of misconceptions about these new rules and each referee has a different idea of what the interpretation is. Take note that officially and despite anything else you might have heard-----

1. There is no such rule which forbids a back line spiker from landing in the attack area.
 2. The receiving team may not block a serve. Also the serve can not be spiked unless the attacker takes off from behind the attack line.
- So there you have it, please adjust your refereeing accordingly.

NATIONALS Already this year Victorian under age teams have competed in National Titles. The under 20's were held in Canberra with the result that the boys finished fourth and the girls finished fifth. Quite a good deal more success was achieved at the National under 17 titles in Brisbane where the boys finished second to N.S.W. and the Girls finished fourth.

At these titles the concept of a National Junior Development Squad was launched and players selected will join together to train for future International events; these include the World Cup, the Asian Games and the Olympic Games in 1988.

Victoria has players which have been selected because of their outstanding potential and they will as far as we can gather, be offered some form of scholarship to the AIS in Canberra in the near future. The form this scholarship takes will vary from player to player and may take the form of a full time scholarship, a part time or a visiting scholarship.

JUNIORS → →

Volleyball Victoria is conscious of the need to have young players involved in the game of volleyball and that the Mini Volleyball concept as outlined in the back of our rule books is hopelessly inadequate to this end.

Over the past months the ruling body in Victoria has been working on a new game for the primary age children to play which will directly lead them into Volleyball as we know it. This is designed to replace the existing misconceptions about the game at junior levels. The new game will be launched soon. Posters representing the skills of the game will be available. The new rules are soon to be ratified. The game is known as Volleyball, pure and simply not as Mini Volleyball or any other name. For some purists the rules may seem strange but they will achieve the result of initiating primary age students to an exciting game that is easy to master and incorporates the skills of volleyball

Some of the new rules are

-a smaller court area

a much lower net; servers are permitted to serve within

the court area; A team is to consist of six players, four of which are on court at any time with the other two rotating on. This game is already being played in the Doncaster and Templestowe region where a regular competition is being run by B.E.V.A.
