Having investigated my wife's ^{infirmary} business for taxation purposes I find that the net income for 1932-33 financial year was £17.7.1² present stock value 5/- and liabilities to wholesale merchants £17.8.1.

There is rent payable of property £52 i.e. over 12 months due. As there is little prospect of relief work for a month or more and present finances have been exhausted I desire to appeal for a review of my sustenance application, or if I am still barred from sustenance what steps would the committee advise me to take.

Doing so accounts against the business it would cause serious embarrassment to close the business besides hindering prospects of gaining advantage of any general improvement locally.

If necessary I desire a personal interview.
