I am

writing to ask your help. As ever since the relief tax came into force my husband has had it taken out of his cheques & yet now that he has been out of work since 2 mos we couldn't get one scrap of relief work or sustenance because we shifted to where we would have a roof over our heads. We have never asked relief before, but have battled along without help. However under the circumstances I must ask for help in the way of clothing & bedclothes. For about 4 mths ago everything we had was destroyed by fire, however as it was warm weather we managed to get a few things to carry on, but its a different problem with the winter coming on & 5 children & our 2 selves to keep warm. Hoping you can give us a little help.
