Dear Sir,

At a special meeting of this Association held on Friday last to discuss the Sustenance ~~Act~~, the following resolution was carried.

"That the Unemployed Ratepayers' & Citizens' Association demand the right to work for their full amount of sustenance as prescribed for under the Act and that we urge the Government to make funds available to the Council to carry on the supervision of the work."

The following resolution was also carried,

"That the City Council be urged to keep all agitators clear of sustenance works (including lunch hour) whilst men are employed thereon."

The Association feel that the Council should give its supervisors the authority to keep all agitators well away from where men are working and to thus prevent mass and stop work meetings which we consider are not in the best interests of the men.

In connection with the first resolution, I have to state that the Association is compiling a list of works which we suggest will absorb further gangs, and also that the resolution has been forwarded to the Honorable Premier and to the Honorable Minister of Sustenance.

We trust a very speedy adjustment of this difficult matter is in sight.
