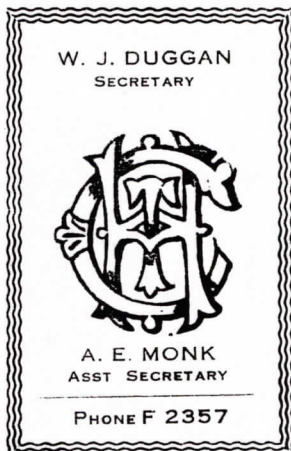

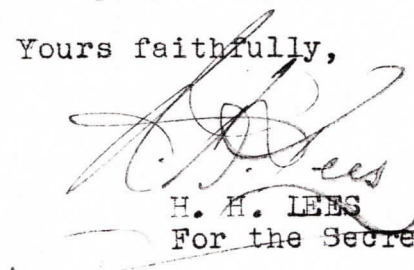
The following are extracts from a letter received from the Bendigo Branch of the Central Unemployed Committee :

1. "The unemployed of Bendigo should not be penalised through the inability of the Bendigo City Council to provide work."
2. "Furthermore, since the cut in the dole we have been rising in hours; single men are now working 18 hours 30 minutes for 24/- instead of 17 hours 44 minutes."
3. "Who should control the Government hand-outs, clothes, etc.? We are of the opinion that the matter should be in the hands of the Public Assistance Committee as provided under the Act."

The foregoing are submitted for the favor of your perusal.

I shall be glad if you will ^{Kindly} advise me as to whether the allegations contained therein are correct, and also have the several matters investigated with a view to seeing that any injustice done to the local unemployed may be removed.
