Dear Sir/

Owing to the excessively cold and wet Winter a higher demand than usual was made upon the wood supplied by the Government for distribution amongst the Unemployed in Bendigo, with the result that the quota has been exceeded and normally no further supplies will be available for several weeks.

This extra distribution was made in good faith and was distributed amongst deserving cases. I should be glad if you would kindly make representations to the Sustenance Department with a view to authority being given for a further supply of wood to be made available and if the request is acceded to I shall endeavour to co-ordinate with the local Forestry offices with the object of seeing that the issues will be so regulated that the position will be in order before the next Winter issue is due.

To do this will involve fairly drastic curtailment of the issues, meanwhile if it would be at all possible for an extra issue to be authorised this would be very gratefully appreciated.
