Australia Day Pageant: The 1982 Transport Pageant was held on a fine Sunny Monday 1st February, 1982. Our tram, No.27, performed excellently along with the Bendigo Trust Birney and MMTB trams L 104, 180 and V214. A total of 2,229 passengers travelled on the vintage trams and our Society should gain about \$200 from fares. We thank the staff of the Preston Tramway Workshops who, as in earlier cavalcades, have assisted us greatly in preparing our tram for this important day.

Our Sales Tent in the Fitzroy Gardens proved very successful and revenue was approximately \$750.00 No.27 was returned to Ballarat on Wednesday, 3rd February along with Maxim Traction tram No.39 which has been stored at Ballarat East. A good turnout of volunteer workers over the last weekend of January completed the trackwork from the front of the new depot into the shed to allow No.39 to be delivered. The MMTB efficiently supplied two No.1 bogies (off W2 trams) to allow No.39 to be sat on as 39's bogies were sent to a local engineering works where they are to be brought back to an operational standard. Special thanks is due to our willing workers for the extra effort carried out over this whole project.

Begonia Festival: The trams have operated every day from 25th February to Thursday 11th March with the exception of Friday 5th March and this covered the period of the famous Begonia Festival. Patronage over this cime was better than it has been in the previous few years and on Sunday 7th March we carried 1173 passengers which was the second highest figure on a single day since Labour Day Monday 1975 which was the first year we operated. The weather was very wet on Monday 8th March and this greatly affected attendances in the Gardens for the big parade and we only carried 345 passengers.

Our intensive January running saw 3664 passengers carried which was 600 higher than the same period last year. We carried 181 passengers in Ballarat on the Australia Day holiday. During February 1223 passengers

were carried.

Adelaide Tour: A group of eight members travelled to Adelaide for the Silver Jubilee of the Adelaide Tramway Museum. from 20th to 21st March.

Tramcar Maintenance: Tram No.40 is up on jacks to allow the bogies to be removed. No.39's bogies which are being brought up to running standard, may be placed under 40 to make this tram mobile again. Single truck tram No.33 is fully operational and the new motor support bearings have roven a great success. The tram rolls very freely and the motors sit so steady in the truck frame that we realise a course of action to get motor bearings for other trams must be implemented.

Former MMTB W3 class tram 661 is currently being painted brown and cream and will have the route boxes removed to give it a more

vintage appearance.

Member Peter Allen (No not the one who's 'going to Rio') has been working on single truck tram No.26 converting the drop ends for open cross bench seating. This tram will be restored to the former glory of the open 'California Combination' tram. It will be painted red and cream, the colours of the Electric Supply Company of Victoria, and this is actually how the tram operated for the first few years of its time in Ballarat.

Investigations are still being carried out regarding the supply of new wheels for our trams and Engineer, Warren Doubleday, has been negotiating with the Bendigo Trust and the Commonwealth Steel Company. The Bendigo Trust has been helping us in the purchase of new trolley wheels as our supply is exhausted and some of the trams are definitely due for replacement wheels.

Depot works: Construction of the changing room at the rear of the shed is proceeding well. Virtually all the supply of broken tile piping has been removed from the rear of the building and placed between 4 & 5 roads and topped with quarry fines. A load of course sand was deliverered for use in the sand boxes of trams. This is the first time we have had to replenish our stock off sand for a couple of years.
