Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting of the Ballarat Tramway Museum Inc. (Association No. A0031819K) will be held at the Ballarat Tram Depot, South Gardens Reserve, on Sunday 23 October 2005, commencing at 2.00pm.

Nominations are called for the following positions on the Museum's Board of Management which fall vacant on that date:

President Vice President (two positions) Honorary Secretary Honorary Treasurer Ordinary Board Members (six positions)

Any two members may nominate any other member to serve as an Office Bearer or an Ordinary Board Member. At the time of nomination, the nominee, proposer and seconder must be financial members for the nominee to be entitled to be a candidate for election Association.

Any nomination must be in accordance with the Rules of Association. All nominations are to be sent in writing to the Returning Officer, to reach him/her not later than 5:00pm on Sunday 9 October 2005.

A member may be nominated as a candidate for more than one position on the Board, provided that upon election to any position on the Board, the member's nomination for any other position shall not apply.

Recent Acquisitions

The Museum has obtained two interesting items for its collection. The first, which came just in time for publication in the new book was a photo of two electric trams and an ex horse tram being shunted by hand at the bottom of Sturt St, near Grenville St

This is the first photo of this type of operation we have seen. One of the electric trams is cross bench car No. 19 and the other ESCo 17. The ex horse tram has a number of people on the top deck. The photo was taken during a summer day. The photo raises the question concerning the operation of the trailers – were they towed by the cross bench cars as well? We have only seen photos of them being towed by the ESCo combination trams.

The other item is a notebook of tram driver Jack Prisk along with some other items. Jack joined ESCo in 1908 and was still working for the SEC in October 1943, past his 65th birthday. The notebook we think dates from 1913 when one-man trams were introduced and drivers or motormen had to issue tickets as well.

It lists entries for specific days and dates (matches the calendar for 1913) giving details of the value of tickets issued and the amount returned.

Roadworks in Wendouree Parade

The City of Ballarat is reconstructing the kerb and channel between Pipers on the Parade (the Gardens Kiosk) and Windmill Drive North. They also intend to formally pave between the kerb and channel and the edge of the tramway track.

In the section of track up to St. Aidans Drive, the tram track has been subject to flooding following the reconstruction of the roadway. This was due to the footpath between the lake and tram track being higher than the roadway and the water being unable to get away. The council has recently installed a concrete spoon drain across the footpath to alleviate the problem. Hopefully another one will soon be constructed to further assist.
