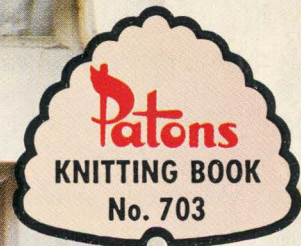

# Brushed Ariel

## 'HIGHLIGHT'

### PATONS ARIEL TRIPLE KNITTING

80% WOOL 20% MAN-MADE FIBRES

• This hat has been specifically designed for **PATONS ARIEL** — if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

#### USE PATONS — TO BE SURE!

To fit an average size head . . . . . 2 balls

Patons Beehive Knitting Needles: 1 pair No. 4.

$\frac{1}{2}$  yard Petersham Ribbon.

A Teazle Brush.

TENSION: 9 stitches to 2 inches in width, measured over plain smooth fabric. Check tension — see page 19.

ABBREVIATIONS: See page 19.

**MAIN PART** — Using No. 4 Needles, cast on 28 stitches.

1st row.—Knit. 2nd row.—Purl.

Rep. 1st and 2nd rows for 22 ins. Cast off.

**THE CROWN**—Using No. 4 Needles, cast on 10 stitches.

1st row.—Knit. 2nd row.—Purl.



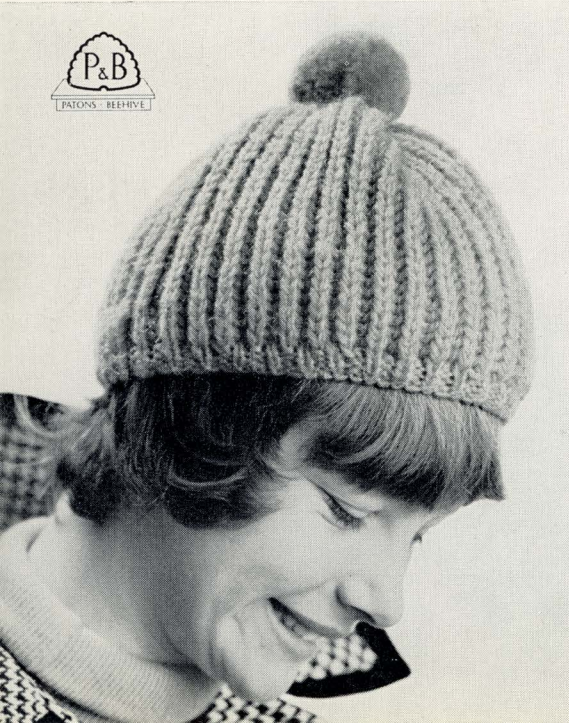
Continue in plain smooth fabric, inc. once at each end of needle in every row until there are 20 sts. on needle.

Work 6 rows without shaping.

Dec. once at each end of needle in next and every alt. row until 10 sts. remain.

Work 2 rows without shaping. Cast off.

**TO MAKE UP**—Fold main part in half right sides facing, and using a fine back-stitch seam, sew back seam. Fold 5 sts. at one side and slip-stitch in position on wrong side to form hem. Run a gathering thread around other side and draw up to fit crown. Using a fine back-stitch seam, sew crown in position, placing cast-off sts. to seam. Brush lightly. Trim with ribbon as illustrated.

### PATONS ARIEL TRIPLE KNITTING

80% WOOL 20% MAN-MADE FIBRES

• This cap has been specifically designed for **PATONS ARIEL** — if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

#### USE PATONS — TO BE SURE!

To fit an average size head . . . . . 3 balls

Patons Beehive Knitting Needles—

Loose Knitters . . . . . 1 pair No. 6

Average Knitters . . . . . 1 pair No. 5

Tight Knitters . . . . . 1 pair No. 4

Needle size in instructions is that for Average Knitters.

**'JAUNTY'** (Continued from opposite page)

Needle size depends upon your tension, which should be 9½ stitches to 2 inches in width, measured over plain smooth fabric. Check tension—see page 19.

**ABBREVIATIONS:** See page 19. M.1.P. = make 1 purlwise by picking up loop that lies between st. just worked and following st. and purling into back of it. K.1 Below = knit into next st. one row below, at the same time slipping off stitch above.

**Using** No. 5 Needles, cast on 82 stitches.  
Work 3 rows in K.1, P.1 rib.

**Next row.**—P.2, (M.1.P., P.8) ten times. (92 sts.)

**Next row.**—K.1, \* P.1, K.1 Below, rep. from \* to last st., K.1.

Rep. last row until work measures 5 ins. from commencement.

Work 2 rows in K.1, P.1 rib.

**Next row.**—K.2 tog. all across row.

Break off yarn, thread end through remaining sts., draw up and fasten off securely.

**TO MAKE UP**—Do not press. Using a fine back-stitch seam, join back seam. Make a large pom-pom (see page 19) and sew to top of Cap.

**'TOPNOTCHER'**

**PATONS ARIEL TRIPLE KNITTING**

80% WOOL 20% MAN-MADE FIBRES

● This hat has been specifically designed for **PATONS ARIEL** — if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

**USE PATONS — TO BE SURE!**

To fit an average size head . . . . . 3 balls

Patons Beehive Knitting Needles—1 pair No. 6.

A Teazle Brush.

**TENSION:** 10 stitches to 2 inches in width, measured over plain smooth fabric. Check tension—see page 19.

**ABBREVIATIONS:** See page 19.

**THE CROWN**—Cast on 10 stitches.

**1st row.**—Inc. once in first st., knit to last st., inc. once in last st.

**2nd row.**—Purl.

Rep. 1st and 2nd rows until there are 22 sts. on needle.

Work 5 rows without shaping.

Dec. once at each end of needle in next and every alt. row until 10 sts. remain. Cast off.

**THE BRIM**—Cast on 35 stitches.

**1st row.**—Knit. **2nd row.**—Purl.

Rep. 1st and 2nd rows until work measures 19 ins.

Cast off.

**TO MAKE UP**—Using a fine back-stitch seam, sew up back seam and sew crown in position, easing brim to fit. Lightly brush.

**PATONS FUZZY WUZZY**

55% ANGORA 45% WOOL

80% WOOL 20% NYLON MOTHPROOFED

• This hat has been specifically designed for **PATONS FUZZY WUZZY, BRI-NYLON 4-Ply** or **PATONYLE KNITTING YARN 4-Ply**—if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

**USE PATONS—TO BE SURE!**

**Size A—Measurement around face, 12 ins.**

Fuzzy Wuzzy	2 balls
Bri-Nylon, 4-Ply	2 balls
Patonyle, 4-Ply	2 balls

**Size B—Measurement around face, 13½ ins.**

Fuzzy Wuzzy	2 balls
Bri-Nylon, 4-Ply	2 balls
Patonyle, 4-Ply	2 balls

**Patons Beehive or Queen Bee Knitting Needles—**

**Loose Knitters—**

1 pair each Nos. 11 and 13. (Bri-Nylon Nos. 12 and 14)

**Average Knitters—**

1 pair each Nos. 10 and 12. (Bri-Nylon Nos. 11 and 13)

**Tight Knitters—**

1 pair each Nos. 9 and 11. (Bri-Nylon Nos. 10 and 12)

Needle sizes in instructions are those for Average Knitters.

Needle size depends upon your tension, which should be 7½ stitches to 1 inch in width, measured over plain smooth fabric. Check tension—see page 19.

**ABBREVIATIONS:** See page 19. "Bobble" = make bobble by (P.1, K.1, P.1) into next st., thus making 3 sts. out of next st., turn, K.3, turn, P.3, slip 2nd and 3rd sts. over first st.

*Instructions are for smaller size A. Larger size B is shown thus [B—...]. Where one set of figures is given, this applies to both sizes.*

**THE HEAD PIECE—**Using No. 12 (Bri-Nylon No. 13) Needles, cast on 103 [B—119] stitches.

**1st row.**—K.2, \* P.1, K.1, rep. from \* to last st., K.1.

**2nd row.**—K.1, \* P.1, K.1, rep. from \* to end of row.

Rep. 1st and 2nd rows three times.

Using No. 10 (Bri-Nylon No. 11) Needles, proceed as follows:—

**\*\* 1st row.**—K.1, \* K.1t.b.l., P.3, rep. from \* to last 2 sts., K.1t.b.l., K.1.

**2nd row.**—K.1, \* P.1t.b.l., K.3, rep. from \* to last 2 sts., P.1t.b.l., K.1.

**3rd row.**—K.1, \* K.1t.b.l., P.1, "Bobble", P.1, K.1t.b.l., P.3, rep. from \* to last 6 sts., K.1t.b.l., P.1, "Bobble", P.1, K.1t.b.l., K.1.

**4th row.**—As 2nd row.

**5th and 6th rows.**—As 1st and 2nd rows.

**7th row.**—K.1, \* K.1t.b.l., P.3, K.1t.b.l., P.1, "Bobble", P.1, rep. from \* to last 6 sts., K.1t.b.l., P.3, K.1t.b.l., K.1.

**8th row.**—As 2nd row. \*\*

Continue in patt. as given from \*\* to \*\* until work measures 6½ [B—7] ins. from commencement, ending with a purl row.

Cast off.

**THE TIE—**Using No. 12 (Bri-Nylon No. 13) Needles, cast on 9 stitches.

**1st row.**—K.2, (P.1, K.1) three times, K.1.

**2nd row.**—K.1, (P.1, K.1) four times.

**PATONS FUZZY WUZZY**

55% ANGORA 45% WOOL

● This pixie has been specifically designed for **PATONS FUZZY WUZZY**—if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

**USE PATONS—TO BE SURE!**

To fit Average First Size . . . . . 1 ball

Patons Beehive or Queen Bee Knitting Needles  
—1 pair No. 9.

One Small Button.

TENSION: 7 stitches to 1 inch in width,  
measured over plain smooth fabric. Check  
tension—see page 19.

ABBREVIATIONS: See page 19.



*Fuzzy Dixie from just one ball!*

**HEAD PIECE** — Using No. 9 Needles, cast on 31 stitches.

**1st row.**—K.1, (P.1, K.1) twice, knit to end of row.

**2nd row.**—K.1, (P.1, inc. once in next st.) eleven times, P.3, (K.1, P.1) twice, K.1. (42 sts.)

Continue in patt. with moss stitch borders as follows:—

**1st row.**—K.1, (P.1, K.1) twice, \* K.1, y.fwd., K.2 tog., rep. from \* to last st., K.1.

**2nd row.**—K.2, \* y.fwd., K.2 tog., K.1, rep. from \* to last 4 sts., (P.1, K.1) twice.

These 2 rows form patt.

Continue in patt. until work measures 10½ ins. from commencement, finishing at end of a 1st patt. row.

**Next row.**—K.1, (P.1, P.2 tog.) eleven times, P.3, (K.1, P.1) twice, K.1. Cast off.

**THE BAND**—Using No. 9 Needles, cast on 5 stitches.

**1st row.**—(K.1, P.1) twice, K.1.

Rep. 1st row for 10 ins.

**Next row.**—K.1, P.1, y.r.n., P.2 tog. (for buttonhole), K.1.

Work 3 rows in moss stitch.

**Next row.**—K.1, P.3 tog., K.1.

**Next row.**—K.1, P.1, K.1.

**Next row.**—K.3 tog. Fasten off.

**TO MAKE UP**—Using a flat seam, join back seam to form pixie. Leaving 2 ins. at each end of Band, stitch lower edge of Pixie to remainder, easing in fullness at centre back. Sew on button to correspond with buttonhole.

Continue in rib until band measures 24 ins. from commencement.

Cast off in rib.

**TO MAKE UP**—**Fuzzy**—With a dry cloth and warm iron, press lightly. **Bri-Nylon, 4-Ply**—Do not press. **Patonyle, 4-Ply**—With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press lightly. Fold head piece in half with ribbing at front edge. Using a fine back-stitch seam, sew up back seam. Run a gathering thread through lower edge of head piece. Using a flat seam sew head piece to centre 7½ [B—8] ins. of tie, easing fullness to centre 6 ins. of tie. Finally, press all seams.



# Button-up Helmet to beat the wind!

## 'HEAD HUGGER'

### PATONS ARIEL TRIPLE KNITTING

80% WOOL 20% MAN-MADE FIBRES

• This garment has been specifically designed for **PATONS ARIEL** — if other yarns are used, you cannot be sure of the quantity required or that the result will be satisfactory.

**USE PATONS — TO BE SURE!**

To fit average size head—  
**Dark . . . . 2 balls    Light . . . . 2 balls**

**Patons Beehive Knitting Needles**—1 pair No. 6.  
 Two Buttons.

**TENSION:** 10 stitches to 2 inches in width, measured over plain smooth fabric. Check tension — see page 19.

**ABBREVIATIONS:** See page 19. D. = Dark, L. = Light.

**Beginning** at face edge, using D., cast on 72 stitches.



**1st row.**—Knit.    **2nd row.**—Purl.

**3rd row.**—Knit. Join in L.

**4th row.**—As 3rd row.    **5th row.**—As 2nd row.

**6th row.**—As 3rd row.

**7th row.**—P.4, \* inc. once in next st. purlways, P.8, rep. from \* to last 5 sts., inc. once in next st., P.4. (80 sts.)

Proceed as follows:—

Using D., rep. 1st and 2nd rows twice.

Using L., rep. 1st row twice, 2nd row once, then 1st row once.

(The purl stripe of 3 rows is right side of work).

Carry the colours from one stripe to next loosely up edge of work and for a smooth edge, pick up next colour from behind last one.

Rep. last 8 rows until there are 5 purl stripes on right side of work.

**Next row.**—Using L., K.25, K.2 tog., (K.2, K.2 tog.) seven times, knit to end of row.

Work 7 rows in plain smooth fabric.

**Next row.**—K.23, K.2 tog., (K.1, K.2 tog.) eight times, knit to end of row.

Work 7 rows in plain smooth fabric.

**Next row.**—K.21, (K.2 tog.) five times, K.1, (K.2 tog.) five times, knit to end of row.

Work 3 rows in plain smooth fabric.

Cast off purlways.

**THE NECKBAND**—Fold work in half and using a flat seam, sew up back seam. Using D., cast on 4 stitches, then knit up 58 sts. along neck edge, turn, cast on 4 stitches and proceed as follows:—

**1st row.**—K.4, \* P.2, K.2, rep. from \* to last 6 sts., P.2, K.4.

**2nd row.**—K.6, \* P.2, K.2, rep. from \* to last 4 sts., K.4.

Rep. 1st and 2nd rows once.

**5th row.**—K.2, y.fwd., K.2 tog. (for buttonhole), \* P.2, K.2, rep. from \* to last 6 sts., P.2, K.4.

Continue in rib and garter st. until work measures 3 ins., working a buttonhole in following 10th row. Cast off loosely in rib. Sew on buttons to correspond with buttonholes.
