

## **COURT OF PETTY SESSIONS**

Messrs. W. A. Andrew and J. L. Scott, J's.P. were on the Bench on Thursday.

Reuben Locke, charged by Constable Ross with riding a motor bicycle without having secured a license, said that he had only had the bike for a week and was riding to the garage. Fined £2, or in default, distress.

Robert Davidson, charged by Constable Ross with playing two-up, at Treagus' quarry, Brooklyn, on Sunday, September 11, did not appear, and was fined £3 or four days' imprisonment. Constable Ross said that when he raided the ring, the players ran away, leaving 6/1 in the ring. The players hailed mainly from Footscray.

John Alfred Munday, who was one of the players caught, admitted losing 1/-. A similar sentence was imposed.

A number of parents were fined for neglecting to send their children to school for the statutory period.
