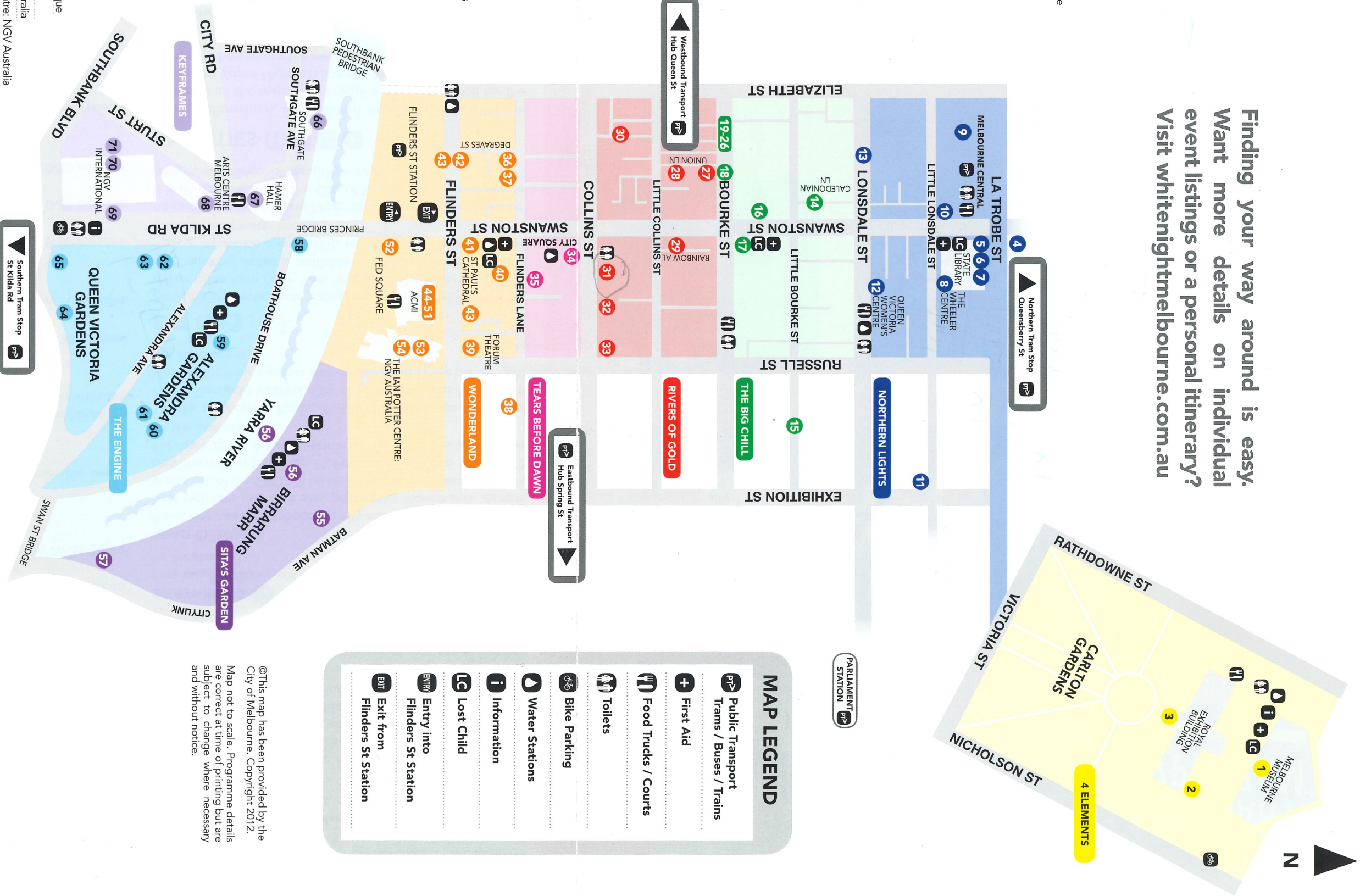

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

White Night Melbourne is an all-night, free cultural event held over a single night in summer in the heart of the city. With the entire programme running from 7pm – 7am, it truly is a night like no other. Arrive and leave whenever suits you, and if you can, think about coming outside of the most popular times of 9pm – 11.30pm. With transport running all night you can arrive at any time.

This year, White Night Melbourne is spread over even more city blocks, from the National Gallery of Victoria in the south to Melbourne Museum in the north. It will be nearly impossible to see absolutely everything on offer, so the best way to sample White Night is to choose which precinct to arrive at and let the night unfold from there.

GETTING AROUND

There are a variety of ways to get to and from the event throughout the night.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

PTV is helping customers get to and from White Night by running trains, trams, NightRider buses and some SmartBuses all night.

METROPOLITAN TRAINS

From 8pm – 3.30am, trains will be running every 20-30 minutes on all lines.

From 3.30am – 6.30am, trains will be running every 60 minutes on all lines.

METROPOLITAN TRAMS

From 5pm – 1am, trams will be running every 5-10 minutes on all lines.

From 1am – 4am, trams will be running every 10-20 minutes on all lines.

From 4am – 8am, trams will be running every 20-30 minutes on all lines.

METROPOLITAN BUSES

From 1.30am – 5.30am, NightRider buses will be running every 30 minutes.

From midnight – 6.30am, SmartBuses will be running every 30 minutes.

City Loop train stations (with the exception of Flagstaff Station) will be open all night. Recommended access to the northern end of the city is from Melbourne Central or Parliament Stations. Please ensure you travel with a valid myki.

Dedicated transport hubs will be located around the city where you can access tram, bus and taxi services. These hubs are clearly marked on the map. For more detailed information on public transport for the event, see ptv.vic.gov.au/whitenight.

DRIVING / CAR PARKS

With road closures in place for the event, some carparks in the central CBD will not be accessible on the night. We recommend parking at the edges of the CBD and walking into the event precinct. A wide variety of parking options are available – visit the website for locations.

Drop off points for patrons (including those with accessibility needs) will be located to the south, on the corner of St Kilda Rd and Linlithgow Avenue, and at the northern end at Russell Street and Victoria Street.

BIKE PARKING

Free bicycle parking will be offered from 7pm – 7am. See map for locations.

ROAD CLOSURES

Road closures throughout the city have been determined to best facilitate safe and easy pedestrian movements. Access in and out of the CBD will be restricted to emergency services only from 6pm Saturday 21 February until 7am Sunday 22 February 2015. A full schedule of road closures is available on the website.

Thanks to Victoria Police, Public Transport operators and Public Transport Victoria, City of Melbourne and Ambulance Victoria for their support and consultation in the planning of the 2015 event.

EAT

Participating restaurants, cafes, food courts and food trucks will be open from 7pm – 7am. Visit the website for full details. Free drinking water is available at locations marked on the map. It might be a hot night, so think about bringing your own refillable water bottle.

All public areas of White Night Melbourne are alcohol free. It is an offense within the City of Melbourne to consume or carry opened alcohol in public areas.

FACILITIES

Toilets, information, lost children and first aid facilities are indicated on the map. If you require assistance, look for the uniformed White Night Melbourne Marshals or security staff stationed throughout the event precincts.

Remember, White Night Melbourne is a really popular event, so a little time spent thinking about how you will get there, when to arrive and what to see, will make for a great experience. There is so much on offer that you don't have to see everything. Take advantage of the quieter spaces to rest and recharge and enjoy your evening.

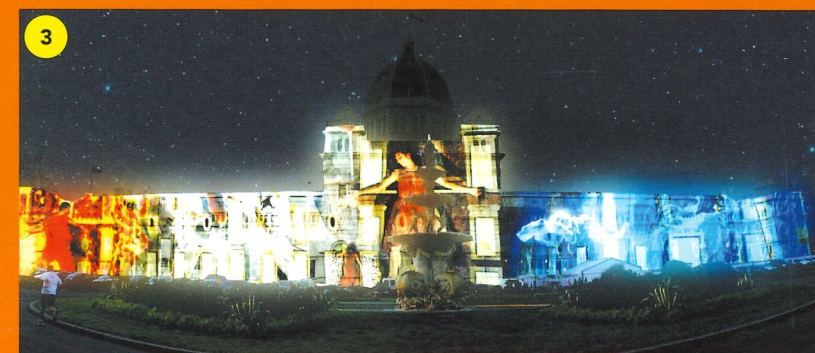
