Circular to all those interested in a local historical society for the Diamond Creek district

During the last Town Fair held in Diamond Creek at the end of March, two local buildings of historical interest were open to the public. In both cases more than 100 people visited the properties concerned and it became evident that there was a great deal of interest among the people who came in finding out and in some cases re-discovering earlier times, personalities, styles of living, building and working.

One of the notable things about the people who expressed interest in this topic during the Fair was that they comprised a cross section of both old and young residents. What they had in common was a feeling of delight, affection and affinity for the environment.

Before the character of 'old' Diamond Creek disappears entirely with the advance of suburbia, it seems worthwhile to bring together interested people so that they may study and share their knowledge and ideas about the history of the district. This could also lead to ways of identifying, retaining and restoring places and items of important historical concern.

The Environmental Action and Conservation group and the Progress Association are sponsoring a meeting to consider forming a local historical society. The meeting will be held (by candlelight) in the old stone cottage on the Lovitt property in Hurstbridge Road, Diamond Creek on Wednesday, June 20th) at 8 p.m. The Vice Chairman of the Royal Historical Society of Victoria, Mr. Harley Foster, will address the meeting on how one goes about studying local history, what aspects need to be identified, how to collect useful as distinct from uselss information, etc.

REPORT ON PUBLIC MEETING HELD TO ASCERTAIN THE EXTENT OF INTEREST IN A LOCAL HISTORICAL SOCIETY IN DIAMOND VALLEY.

The public meeting was arranged by Mesdames. Elaine
Wightman and Marilyn McInnes, was sponsored by the
Diamond Valley and District Environmental Action Group
and the Diamond Creek Progress Association.

It was held on Thursday, the 21st June 1973 at 8 p.m.
at Lovitt's Cottage, Hurstbridge Road, Diamond Creek.

Mr. Ray Rooke presided and some 50 - 60 people attended.
Apologies were received from 13 people.

Useful suggestions and advice was given by the Vice Chairman of the Royal Historical Society of Victoria (Mr. Harley Forster).

Much informed and informative discussion.

It was moved at the meetings conclusion by Mr. W.

Robertson and seconded by Mrs. D. Colvin that "a

steering committee be formed to discuss further the

formation of a group interested in preserving the history

and heritage of the Diamond Valley".

The resolution was unanimously carried and a steering committee of 16 was chosen to meet next on the 16th July, 1973.

During supper a collection was taken up and the donations totalled \$6. 20

- (i) To foster historical interests and knowledge of the Diamond Valley particularly but not exclusively.
- (ii) To collect and preserve items of historical interest, nature and value from in and associated with the Diamond Valley.
- (iii) To compile and keep a historical record of the Diamond Valley.
- (iv) To work towards the establishment of a Museum.
- (v) To work in association with the National Trust of Victoria and any other bodies of similar aims in the preservation of buildings and objects of architectual and historical interest in the Diamond Valley.
- (vi) To co-operate and liaise with all other bodies and organisations having the same or similar aims and objects within and without the Diamond Valley.
- (vii) To retain preserve and conserve the natural environment of the Diamond Valley.
- (viii) To affiliate with the Royal Historical Society of Victoria or such other bodies as may be desirable.
- (ix) To raise funds for the attainment of such aims and objects.
- (x) To do all such other matters and things as may be associated with and ancilliary to the attainment and achievement and fulfillment of any or all of such aims and objects.

Minutes of meeting held at Lovitt's cottage, Monday July 16, 1973.

It was decided to form the "NILLUMBIK HISTORICAL SOCIETY", Nillumbik being the original name of the district in colonial days.
