DEATH OF FARM MACHINERY LEADER

The Managing Director of Sperry New Holland, Mr. Jack Scott died in Melbourne last week at the age of 61.

Mr. Scott had been with Sperry New Holland since its inception in Australia 28 years ago and had built the company from nothing to industry leadership in haymaking and grain harvesting machinery and equipment with a national turnover exceeding \$60 million.

A staff of more than 350 and 170 associated farm machinery dealerships in all States.

At the time of his death, Mr. Scott was

finalising arrangements for the official opening of the Company's new \$12 million headquarters at Cranbourne which he recently described as a "vote of confidence in a beleaguered industry" and as the "emblem of innovation symbolising progress and prosperity in the Australian Farm Machinery industry."

Mr. Scott held Senior Executive positions in Associated Industry organisations such as the Tractor and Farm

Machinery Association and the Metal Trades Industry Association of Australia and was a tireless worker for the industry.

Although eligible for retirement, Mr. Scott only last week called staff together to pledge his personal commitment to continue as Sperry's Chief Executive for as long as it took to pull the company through the current drought and economic recession.
