SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW No. 10.

A By-Law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1890, and numbered 10, for regulating the Sale of Cattle, Horses, Pigs and Poultry in the Dandenong Market, and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1890, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows :—

1. That the sale of Poultry shall commence at 10.30 a.m. Each person bringing poultry into the Dandenong Market for sale shall place the same in the coops provided by the Council, and empty crates must be removed from the yard. No poultry shall be offered for sale in the coops or boxes in which they are brought into the yard, except there is no room in the coops provided by the council.

2. That the sale of Calves commence at 12 o'clock noon, and that the sale of dairy cows commence at 12 o'clock noon.

3. That each auctioneer doing business in the market shall draw lots on each market morning for priority of sale. Dairy cows shall have precedence of sale of all other cattle.

4. That the drawing for priority of sale of cattle shall take place in the office of the market inspector at 11.50 a.m. on the morning of each market day. The inspector shall draw for any auctioneer not being present at the time.

5. That each auctioneer shall be allowed at the rate of three minutes and a half for the sale of each milch cow. Any salesman who shall not have finished the sale of the whole of his milch cows within the allotted time shall stop his sale and finish at the close of the last sale in that class.

6. That any cattle entered after the commencement of the sales shall not be offered until each agent has offered his lot in each class.

7. That horses shall not be offered for sale until the close of the cattle sale.

8. That the market inspector shall be timekeeper, to whom all disputes with reference to this by-law shall be referred, and his decision shall be final.

9. That every person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten (10) pounds.
