Ivy Mills ran the **Wattle Café**; after Mrs Wilcox.

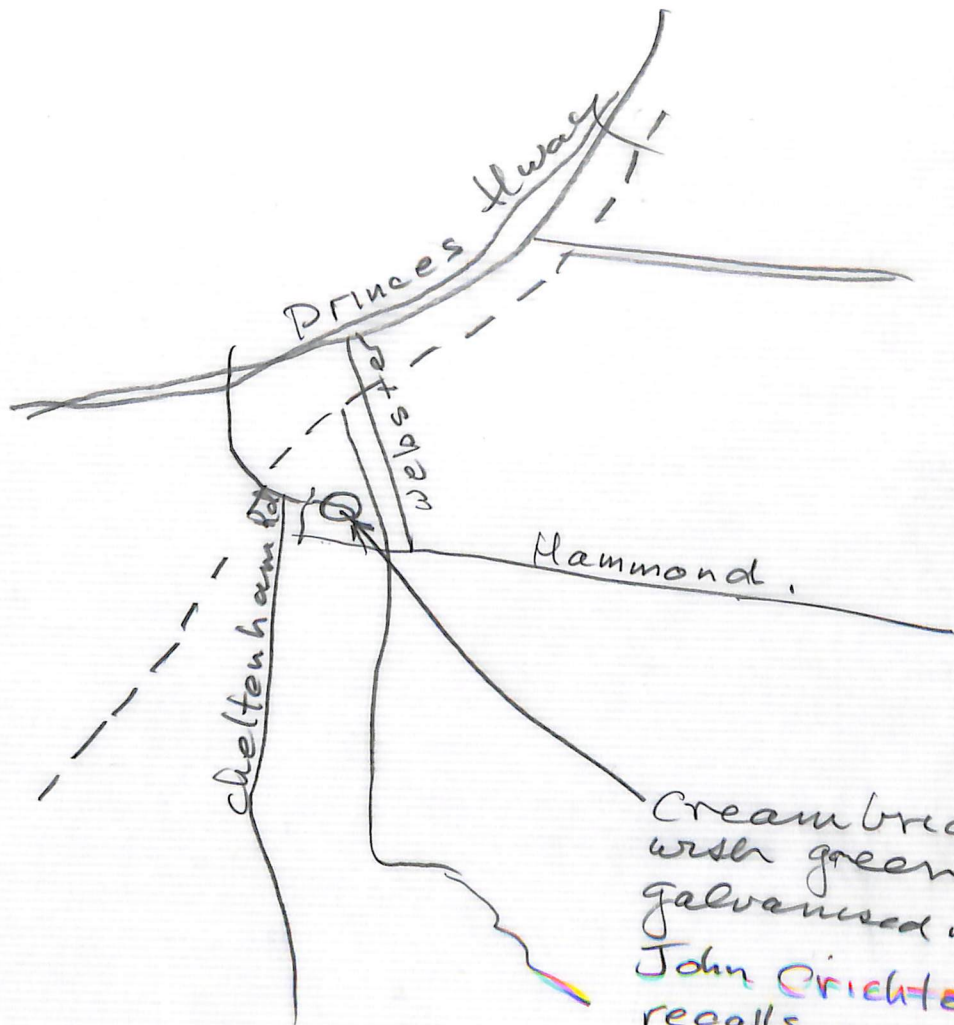
