Amazon science camp entries open

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DANDENONG students have a rare opportunity to take part in Amazon's computer science camp.

The tech giant is encouraging primary school students to apply for its \$150,000 Camp Amazon program at its Dandenong South fulfilment centre.

The camp is designed to inspire children to pursue careers in areas such as robotics, IT and engineering.

Amazon Australia operations director Craig Fuller said the company was excited to launch the Camp Amazon and encourage all students in years 3 to 6 living

in communities near its fulfilment centres to apply.

"We recognise that the jobs of tomorrow require a strong aptitude for STEM; we see it in our growing business and want to be part of the solution," he said.

Each entry must be the entrant's own original work.

Winners will be decided based on passionate responses and being able to travel and attend workshops.
