

## Food law breaches

amenity director Jody Bosman said that in the seven months to the end of July this year, council inspectors had completed 3781 visits to food and health premises.

Required to inspect those businesses annually, council had "a 140 per cent annu-

al inspection regimen" in the last financial year.

Mr Bosman said prosecutions for food safety breaches usually only started when there had been serious non-compliance or a repeated failure to comply with food laws.
