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Green jobs boost

A DANDENONG South company has scored almost \$1 million in Federal Government grants to develop environmentally-friendly technology.

Clean TeQ Limited will receive \$999,903 for development trials of a pre-treatment process that will separate waste from water with no sediment.

Chief executive officer Greg Toll said the funding would allow the company to fast-track development and employ new staff.

"Clean TeQ has almost doubled its staff from 17 to 30 in the past 18 months, and this funding will put us in a position to hire more engineers to undertake this project.

"Thanks to this Federal Government grant we'll be able to trial our pre-treatment technologies that will provide the desalination process of separating waste from water in a safe and environmentally friendly manner."

Isaacs MP Mark Dreyfus was at Clean TeQ last week to announce the grant, made through the Government's Climate Ready grants program. Mr Dreyfus said it was important for the Government to support environmentally friendly technology that helped create green jobs.

"This project will boost the local economy by supporting local jobs in these tough economic times."
