Feeding hungry students helps brake new ground

THE staff members at Dandenong Station Brake & Service Centre (DSBSC) are modest about their involvement with Lunches for Kids, but nearly every week 2,200 local primary school children benefit from the free barbecue organised by DSBSC and other sponsors.

DSBSC is one of the major sponsors who take a mobile barbecue stand to local primary schools and provide a feast of sausages, bread, apples and orange juice. If the kids can afford it, a contribution of 20 cents is appreciated, but, contribution or not, everyone is welcome to enjoy the barbecue.

Although the team members at DSBSC are modest about this community involvement, they are not backward in coming forward about their service. Manager, Trevor Cowling, explains that all customers receive quality service at a competitive price, free pick-up and delivery in the local area and a free safety check.

All vehicles serviced at DSBSC are entitled to free emergency towing for up to 20 km and a free jump-start service which operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week and is backed by Australian Car Care.

The team at DSBSC specialises in brake work but also provides expert EFI and engine tuning, transmission work, air-conditioner servicing, new and change-over clutches and all mechanical repairs and vehicle servicing. The workshop is licensed to do roadworthy tests.

Currently, the cost of a two-wheel brake reline starts at \$79 which includes the free brake inspection. A service and tune-up costs from \$70, plus the cost of parts.

All repairs at the workshop have a six-month, written warranty.

Trevor Cowling pointed out that as DSBSC is located opposite the Dandenong railway station it is convenient for customers to leave their vehicles at DSBSC for servicing, catch a train into town for the day and pick up the vehicle on their return.

The workshop is open on Saturday mornings.
