ONE of Dandenong's best-known business names will disappear from Lonsdale St, on April 30.

Mr Wes Williams, proprietor of W. G. Williams Electrical Store, has sold his premises to a finance firm.

The business has been operating in the main street for 49 years.

But Mr Williams and his son Rob will not be lost to the city's business scene.

Wes will continue with his public address system work, a job he has done for almost 50 years and Rob, who began a marine business from his Mt Eliza home 12 months ago, is looking for a suitable premises in Dandenong.

Mr Williams Snr is well-known for his association with Dandenong Methodist Church and is also a keen boating fan and fisherman.

Rob Williams helped his father conduct Wes Williams' Electrical since leaving school.

The two women who conducted the record shop at Wes Williams Electrical — Miss Jenny Higgins and Mrs Nancy Baker — will not be lost to the Dandenong scene, either.

This week they opened a record shop in Scott St., Dandenong, near The Journal.

Technicians John Williams, who has been employed by Mr Williams for 19 years with his wife Barbara, and Reg Elkin, will now operate a service and sales department with emphasis on servicing electrical goods from Hemmings St., Dandenong West.

Another member of the Williams' "clan", Mr David Brewster, plans to operate a recording studio in Railway Pde.
