## Memorial for Robin Boyd planned

A PUBLIC appeal is to be launched in Victoria to raise funds to reconstruct an old church in South Melbourne as a memorial hall for the Australian architect Robin Boyd.

A committee of interested people headed by Sir Osborn McCutcheon, principal partner in the Melbourne firm of Bates the Smart and McCutcheon, organise the appeal.

The church is one of three buildings in Howe Crescent bought by the Royal Australian Institute of Architects for its new headquarters.

Built in 1873 it will be used as an assembly hall for the
