I have had a discussion with Dorothy regarding your suggestion as to payment for "The Flying Dogtor", which, speaking from memory, were as follows :

- £30 per episode, covering script, pencil rough, and supervision of the artists.
- (2) When we start to show a profit on the programme, an additional £10 per episode.
- (3) If we strike "Bonanza", a further increase of £10 per episode, bringing the total per episode to £50.

We feel that we should do better than this. Therefore, we accept (1) and (2), but revise (3) to provide for a payment to you of  $33 \frac{1}{3\%}$  of the nett profit from any Bonanza selling.

Exploitation of the Property apart from Television:

We feel that the nett profit of any exploitation of the property apart from television, should be divided 50/50 between you and Crawford Productions.

We would be glad to have your reaction to this, because I have strong views on the subject of "gentlemen's agreements". To me they are agreements gentlemen are prepared to put in writing.
