For many of us, the weeks leading up to Christmas are the year's busiest. There are presents to buy and visitors to prepare for. But as of now, it's time to relax and savour the joys of the season. Tonight kids can revel in the magic, while adults reconnect with the true meaning of Christmas.



Five-year-old Emily from Melton is like any five-year-old girl. She's excited about Christmas and wants Santa to bring her a trampoline and a dollhouse.

Emily loves to draw and dress up (especially in her fairy costume), and is a big fan of music. She's told her mum she wants to be a conductor when she grows up, but she could do almost anything she set her mind to. "She's a redhead with an attitude to match," says her mother, Brooke.

Meet Vision Australia's Christmas fairy

The only difference between Emily and her friends is that she is vision impaired. She has early onset retinitis pigmentosa, a condition that causes the retina to deteriorate. Emily has no peripheral vision and it's uncertain how much central vision she has. What is known is her sight is not improving.

Yet Emily's future is bright, thanks to Vision Australia supporting her from infancy. Like most kids her age, Emily loves storytime and she borrows from Vision Australia's Feelix Braille Book Library. The books come in kits along with CDs and tactile objects that help bring the stories to life.

She has already been introduced to braille, in preparation for learning to read and write at school. As her Vision Australia Early Childhood Educator, Amanda Pierini, explains, children who are blind are familiarised with braille as preschoolers in the same way as sighted children are shown how to hold a pencil so they can learn to write at school. Amanda has also briefed Emily's teachers. And next year, a Vision Australia visiting teacher will check Emily's progress at school.

Good luck at big school, Emily, and thanks for being the face of Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®]!

Vision Australia is a living partnership between people who are blind, sighted or vision impaired. We are united by our vision that in the future Australians with blindness or low vision will access and fully participate in every part of life they choose.

Our organisation was formed through the merger of Royal Blind Society, the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind, Vision Australia Foundation and the National Information Library Service. As the largest provider of blindness and low vision services in Australia, we assist more than 41,000 children and adults to live the lives they choose.

We do this by developing commonsense solutions to everyday challenges, providing comprehensive training and enabling easy access to information. We offer a range of services, most of which are free, that can be tailored to a person's level of vision, supporting people who have some remaining sight to those who are blind.

Today some 292,700 Australians are blind or vision impaired. However, as the 'baby boomer' generation ages, this figure is expected to increase to 421,600 in the next 15 years (*ABS: Ausstats, 2004*), which means there will be a greater demand for our services.

Vision Australia depends on generous support from individuals, government, businesses and community groups. Some assist us financially, helping to provide the \$70 million needed annually to fund our essential services, while others donate their time as volunteers.



Ray Martin

John Foreman

With a stellar career as a television journalist for over four decades, Ray has helped shape Australian life both in his professional roles and his extensive charitable and community services.

Ray has worked for the major current affairs and events in television since 1965 on programs including A Current Affair, 60 Minutes, Midday, Four Corners and the Olympic Games. He has received five Gold Logies, Australia's most prestigious television award, in addition to Silver Logies, People's Choice, Variety and Mo awards.

Ray's community service is generous and committed. He spent 10 years as Chairman of the Fred Hollows Foundation and on the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation. As well, he freely offers his services to more than 30 charities and community groups.

There is no better recommendation for the cultural importance of Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®] in Australian life than the fact that this will be Ray's seventeenth year as host.



John Foreman is one of the most respected musical directors in the country. With impressive credentials, he is celebrating 15 years on Australian television.

In 2003 John joined Australian Idol following 12 years as musical director on Good Morning Australia with Bert Newton. In the same year he took over the reins of musical director for Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®]. John also hosts the annual School Spectacular, which is the world's largest variety show.

His song Melbourne Girl was performed by Vanessa Amorosi at the closing of the 2002 Commonwealth Games, while another composition, The Flame, was the anthem of the 2000 Sydney Olympics. John is also a sought-after producer, having worked with Guy Sebastian, Shannon Noll, Marcia Hines and Anthony Callea.

Last year he released his first book, John Foreman: Your Guide to Unlocking the Australian Music Industry, in which he offers practical advice and tips to aspiring entertainers. John is also the host of a new music variety show, The Big Night In With John Foreman.

Starting her career at the age of seven, Dannii worked on programs such as Skyways and The Sullivans, but is best known for Young Talent Time. "People still stop me on the streets to tell me their fond memories of YTT and all the garish outfits we managed to wear!" Dannii finds it ironic that Home and Away was the last show she acted in before boarding a plane to London.

Since 1991 she has released four albums, and The Hits And Beyond, a collection of her best tunes, came out this year. Grease, The 66-date Arena Spectacular was the biggest touring show Dannii has performed in – "Playing Rizzo was a blast".

Dannii has played dream roles such as Lady Macbeth and Esmeralda in Notre Dame de Paris in London's West End. What she most looks forward to is coming back to Australia every year. "Christmas just wouldn't be right without sunshine, a barbecue and my mates."

From treading the boards on Broadway to quickstepping on Dancing With The Stars, Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®] Ambassador David Campbell has become one of the nation's most versatile entertainers. He has starred as Australian rock legend Johnny O'Keefe in Shout! and performed on Broadway, which resulted in a critic from the New York Times describing him as "a natural entertainer who oozes star quality".

It's hard to believe it's been 10 years since David released his debut album, Yesterday Is Now, at the age of 23. A decade later, David has put out The Swing Sessions, a collection of songs inspired by the great crooners of the 1950s. After a period spent following in the footsteps of his father, Jimmy Barnes, and fronting rock bands, David has returned to his classic roots: "My heroes were the ultimate showmen, like Bobby Darin, Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis Jr and Tony Bennett," says David – and their influence is obvious.

Anyone who caught his performance at Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®] last year knows they are in for a treat when David steps onto the stage.

Marina Prior Australian television's golden couple, Bert and Patti have been married for 32 years.

Bert's career started in 1950 and he's since won an array of accolades, comprising 18 Logies (including six Gold Logies) and numerous Pater Awards for his radio work. Australia's premier master of ceremonies received an MBE in 1979 for services to the performing arts and in June he received an OAM for service to the entertainment industry. Bert currently hosts Bert's Family Feud and 20 To 1.

Patti's career began at age four when she started performing in Tivoli pantomimes. She has since worked extensively in radio and television, and performed on stage in Australia and Europe. A career highlight was entertaining troops in Vietnam. Patti performed with Bert on In Melbourne Tonight and in the 1980s they worked together on Ford Super Quiz. Later Patti was a regular on Good Morning Australia, which Bert hosted for 14 years.

Their children, Matthew and Lauren, have established their own successful careers in showbusiness.

One of our greatest performers, Marina's talent is acknowledged internationally. Her first lead role – that of Mabel in Victoria State Opera's The Pirates of Penzance – resulted in her being invited to play Guinevere opposite Richard Harris in Camelot. She went on to perform in Cats, HMS Pinafore, Les Miserables and West Side Story.

Marina is perhaps best known for playing Christine Daae in the original Australian production of The Phantom Of The Opera for three years. Although she has recorded gold and platinum-selling CDs, she relishes performing live. Earlier this year, she starred in the Melbourne Theatre Company's production of The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee.

An acclaimed tour with José Carreras remains one of the highlights of Marina's career. She has received numerous accolades, including three Mo Awards for live entertainment, three Green Room Awards and the Advance Australia Award for her contribution to performing arts. She was recently named one of Australia's 100 Entertainers of the Century. Vision Australia's Carols by Candlelight[®] appreciates Marina's support and is delighted to welcome her back.

One of the most popular singers in Australia, Anthony first came to prominence in the 2004 series of Australian Idol. He currently holds the record for the highest-selling single and fastest-selling single in Australia for his debut single, The Prayer, which featured on his selftitled, multi-platinum debut album.

His new album, A New Chapter introduces the world to his writing talents – Anthony co-wrote all but one of the 15 tracks. But he will not be disappointed if his new work doesn't break records. "Just believing in what you're doing and being true to yourself in what you're delivering, that equally classifies as success," he says.

Anthony has sung the national anthem at many major events, including the Rugby League Tri-Nations Game and the Australian Grand Prix. He has also performed at the Royal Gala for Princess Mary and Prince Frederick of Denmark, and for Queen Elizabeth II.

One of Australia's most respected young actors, Matthew made his directorial debut with Right Here Right Now, which won Best Feature at the Rebelfest International Film Festival. He has played lead roles in numerous films, including Looking for Alibrandi, My Mother Frank, Blurred, Queen Of The Damned, The Bet and Bitter And Twisted.

Matthew is in Foxtel's hit Stupid, Stupid Man and has appeared in All Saints, Grass Roots, Farscape, Water Rats, Thank God You're Here and Changi, for which he received a Logie nomination. He has worked with Australia's leading theatre directors, and has starred with Miranda Otto in the Sydney Theatre Company's Boy Gets Girl and in the Sydney and New York productions of The White Devil.

Ian has developed a reputation as one of Australia's most diverse actors, having worked in film, television and theatre since graduating from NIDA 10 years ago. Since then Ian has performed Shakespeare, touring with the Grin & Tonic Theatre Troupe. He has also appeared in a one-off Royal Shakespeare Company production of Music Hall. Ian is equally at home in musicals such as Cabaret and The Pajama Game. His performance in They're Playing Our Song won him the Green Room Award for best male lead.




